

Becoming Extinct, Wants Birds of Prey Protected

Professional falconer Dieter Rosenkranz of Hornby wants to make people aware that falcons and other birds of prey are becoming extinct in Ontario.

"I would like to show people the beauty of these birds and then perhaps they will have more interest in conserving them," he said.

"Canadians are just not aware that these birds are dying out, but there are still more here than there are in Germany," he said.

ALMOST GONE

Rosenkranz said the peregrine falcon has almost disappeared from Ontario. One man shot 40 great horned owls on his farm near Hespeler last winter, he added.

up "cuter" phrases that will blow off the top of your head later:

- Never give him any spiritual training. Wait until he is 21, and then let him "decide for himself;
- Avoid the use of the word "wrong". It may develop a guilt-complex. This will condition him to believe later, when he is arrested for stealing a car, that society is against him and he is being persecuted;
- Pick up everything he leaves lying around — books, shoes, clothes — and do everything for him so he will be experienced in throwing all responsibility on others;
- Let him read any printed matter he can get his hands on. Be careful that the silverware and drinking glasses are sterilized, but let his mind feast on garbage;
- Quarrel frequently in the presence of your children. In this way they will not be too shocked when the home is broken up later;
- Give a child all the spending money he wants. Never let him earn his own. Why should he have things as tough as you had them?
- Satisfy his craving for food, drink and comfort. See that every sensual desire is gratified. Denial may lead to harmful frustration;
- Take his part against neighbours, teachers, policemen. They are prejudiced against your child.

I think it is worth reading and thinking about.

Dr. Rosenberg heads it "10 simple guidelines to help turn our child into a delinquent."

The Youth Sub-Culture has taken over so much of our society — the school, the theatre, and the films, even the attitudes of many theologians, psychologists and social workers that the "over 30" generation has become a virtual anachronism.

The present mood, however, is no guarantee of a successful program for building the generation of tomorrow. Far from it: many of us are simply preparing our children for future delinquencies.

For those who put to check their own behaviour patterns, here's a permissive little list, one man set down to help his friends gauge their private "success." For want of another title we might properly call his suggestions "Speedy Guidelines Sure to Make Your Child Into a Delinquent."

Here, then, are 10 "simple" ways. If you promise to follow them diligently, you cannot fail.

- Begin with infancy to give the child everything he wants. In this way he will grow up to believe the world owes him a living;
- When he picks up bad words, laugh at him. This will make him think he's cute. It will also encourage him to pick
