School Board Lacks Money
So Swimming Lessons Out

Halton County Separate School Board rejected an offer last week from the Burlington YMCA to give swimming periods to county students at a reduced rate.

The Georgetown separate school and other separate schools in the county have no swimming facilities, but the board ruled it is too short of money.

It turned down the offer last year for the same reason.

ECONOMIC REASONS

Donald Hill, chairman of the education committee, said the refusal was for economic reasons only and not because of a Roman Catholic decree that Catholics may not be members of the YWCA or YMCA.

The same offer was extended to the public school board to bring in Grade III classes for swimming instruction.

Ron Edwards, executive director of the Y said that the public school board had accepted a similar offer for its Grade III classes at a price which does not cover the Y's expenses.

CUT IN HALF

Hill said the separate school board is in such tight financial condition it has to cut its physical education spending requests by more than half and all student field trips have been cancelled.

He said the board has to cut many of its plans to purchase audio-visual teaching aids. Hill said the programs could only be included if taxes are raised again this year.
