Elementary School Children Will Participate in Class Brush-Ins

A child's formative early years in school are important in establishing good dental health habits. Consequently with the co-operation of the Halton Board of Education, the Halton County Health Unit through their Dental Division, provides comprehensive dental education for all school children in the public and separate school system, in kindergarten grades one, two, three and four.

In addition, dental screening is provided for these children in the Oakville and Burlington areas. It should be made quite clear that these dental examinations in the schools are primarily to detect any apparent defects and are not intended to be a substitute for the child's regular visit to the family dentist. Parents should take their children to their dentist on a regular basis.

FREE CLINICS

"The citizens of Halton County living in the Oakville and Burlington areas are very fortunate that they have water fluoridation," Halton's director of Dental Services said in announcing this term's program. "This inexpensive public health preventive measure will prevent tooth decay by up to 60%. The cost per year per person is somewhere in the neighbourhood of ten to twenty cents. That is, for the price of two chocolate bars each year, one is able to half the incidence of tooth decay in their children." However, Halton County

Health officials do not stop here. Fluoride clinics are provided free of charge in Oakville, Burlington, Milton, Acton and Georgetown. At these fluoride clinics children between the ages of 3 and 12 years may have their teeth painted or fluoride "self-applied" by members of the dental staff.

PILOT PROJECT

This free preventive service will prevent tooth decay even further, whether one lives in a fluoridated or non fluoridated area. An appointment may be had by contacting the local Health Unit office.

In North Halton County water fluoridation is not available as yet. Therefore, this year a pilot project will be initiated in September 1970. Halton County Health Unit will be providing a new concept in preventive dentistry — "Self Applied Fluoride Brushing." All the school children in North Halton in the upper grades (6, 7, 8) will be allowed to participate in these brush-ins at their schools. In order for a child to be included, he or she must have a consent form signed by the parent. These forms will be sent home with the child at the appropriate time.

REDUCED 50 PERCENT

In general Halton County has been fortunate in having a dental program in their school system which dates back to the early 1950's. In these past years, epidemiological studies have

shown that the incidence of tooth decay in children has consequently been reduced by almost 50%. Recent studies in the dental division show that approximately four million dollars is spent annually by Halton County citizens for dental treatment.

Preventive measures can reduce decay and consequently the cost of dental care by as much as 85%. In order to reach this goal of preventing 85% of dental disease parents and children must practice good dental health habits on an individual basis.

"In addition, local groups, organizations and communities can do much to promote water fluoridation in their areas if they do not enjoy this advantage at present," Dr. Green said.

SINGLETON TO STUDY EDUCATION

James Singleton, Halton county director of education, is one of three Canadian experts invited to join a U.S. task force to study the system of education in foreign countries. Singleton will join the directors from Windsor and Vancouver and 97 officials from the U.S. in a Kent State University program designed to study education procedures in countries facing particular problems.

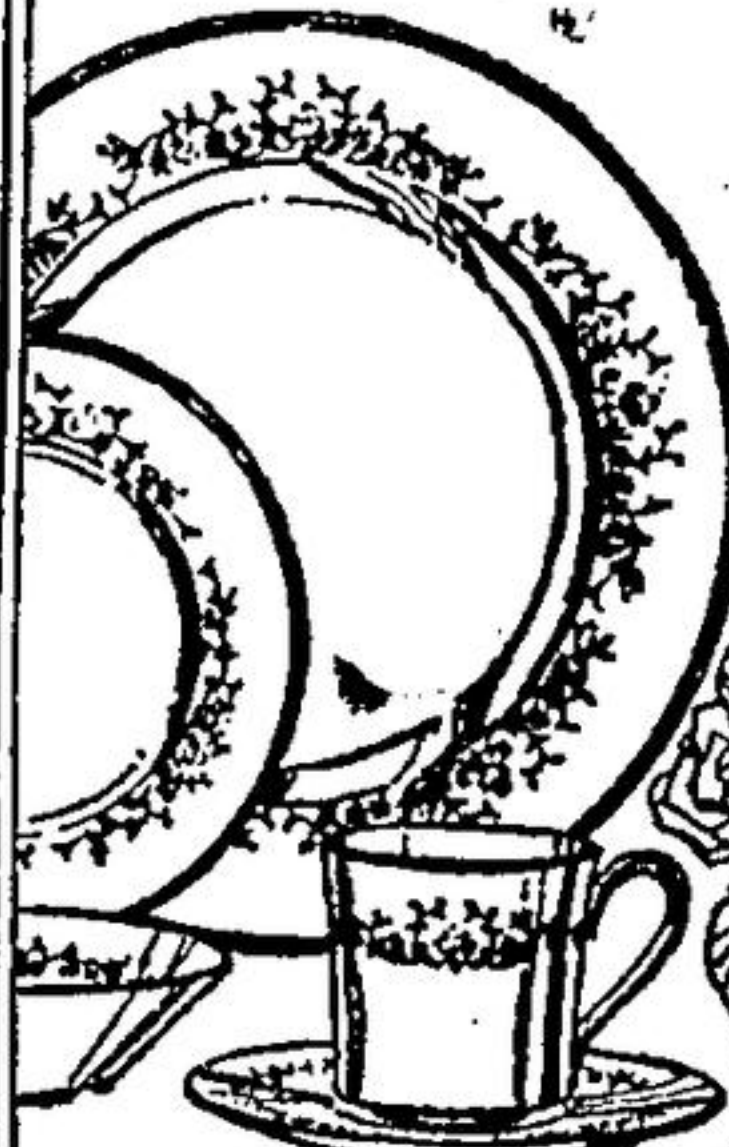

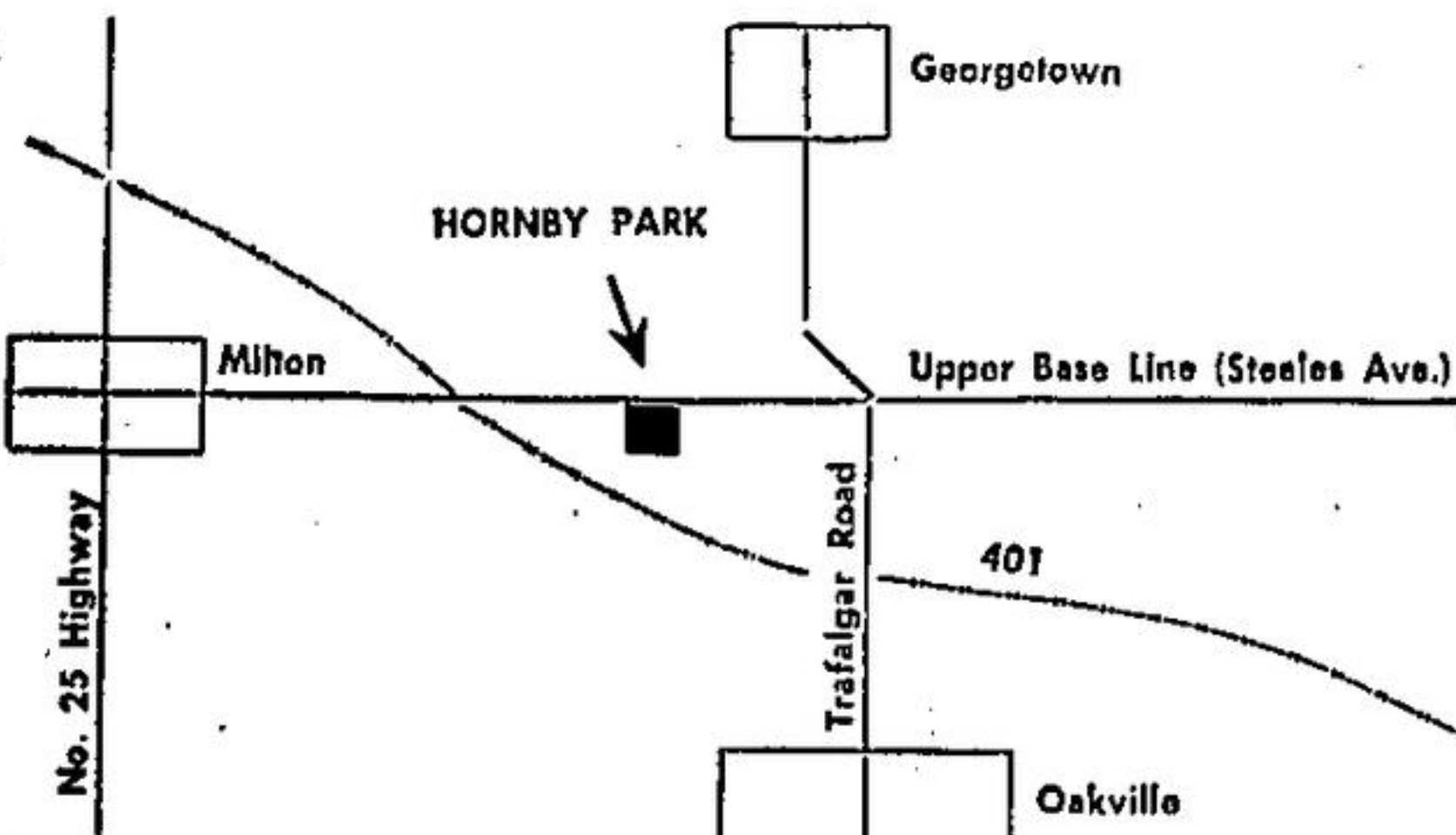
