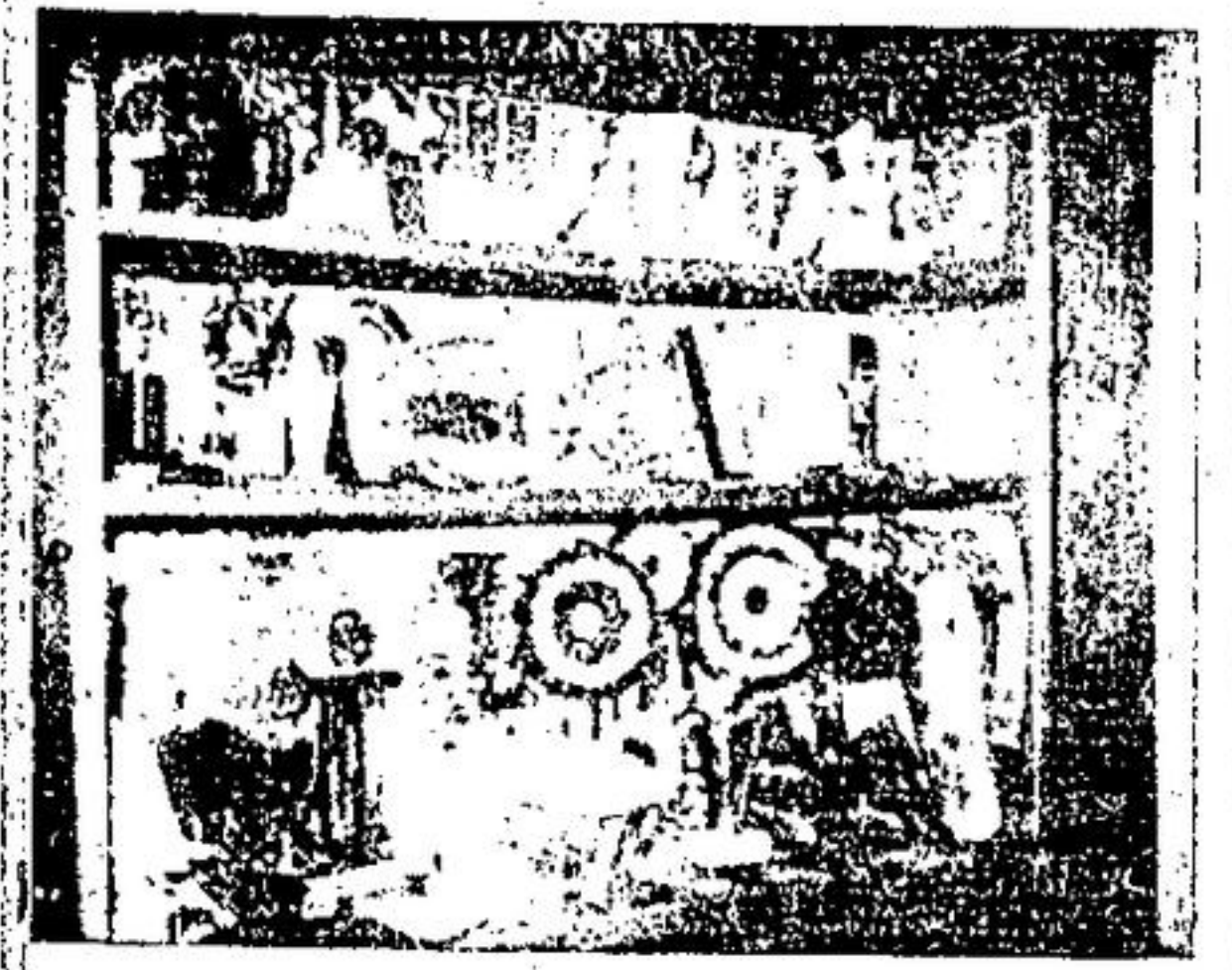


# Wynfield Papillon Stars As Magazine Cover Dog

# Fight Pollution Apathy Speaker Tells Naturalists

Members of the Georgetown District Naturalists Club held their first meeting, Wednesday, Sept. 9, at their new location, Knox Presbyterian Church, Georgetown.

The president, Norman Cramp reported on the summer activities of the club which included a field trip to White Woods at St. Thomas and regularly scheduled Sunday morning walks on the Bruce Trail.

## POLLUTION PROBE

The speaker for the meeting was R. Atfield of Pollution Probe. He spoke about pollution in general and, in particular, on the summer activities of Pollution Probe. This comprised a study of the cottage country of Ontario. The principal pollution agents in these areas, he said, are the large amount of unburnt gas and oil which was emitted from outboard motors, and also the improperly constructed sanitary arrangements in many cottages. He was most concerned with the general apathy of the public in this regard. He urged the club members to become much more active in combating local areas of pollution.

He pointed out that "Survival Day" was set for October 14 and suggested that the club organize some activity to mark this day.

## SAFETY TIP

**DRIVERS** — Freeway driving is different and requires your full attention... especially when entering or leaving these high speed traffic arteries. As you enter a freeway on the acceleration lane always check approaching freeway traffic — then pick up speed so that you merge smoothly at approximately freeway driving speed. To leave a freeway, get into the right lane as you approach the turnoff... signal your intentions well in advance and reduce speed as you enter the turn off lane. Remember, when entering or leaving a freeway, it's important to do so smoothly. Co-operation reduces the chances of freeway collisions.

In the ensuing discussion Charles Hildebrandt, the club's vice president suggested that the club undertake a program of monitoring the effluent from local industries and taking action where serious pollution is observed.
