Fire Prevention Poster Could Win \$100 Prize

Several functions marking Fire Prevention Week, Oct. 4 to 10, were planned at the September meeting of Halton Fire Prevention Bureau held in Milton Fire Hall.

The Bureau annually sponsors a fire prevention poster competition for Grade 5 students in Halton schools and entry forms are to be distributed to the schools during the last week of September. Children will make their posters in school and in mid-October their entries will be picked up for judging in local contests sponsored by the Oakville, Milton, Burlington, Acton and Georgetown fire departments.

ton's winning posters will then go on to a province-wide competition sponsored by the Ontario Association of Fire Chiefs, in which the main prizes are \$100 bonds.

STAY WITH THEM

Bureau chairman Chief M. Holmes of Acton explains, contest and the two main winners plus eight runners-up will be honoured by the Bureau at a banquet scheduled for Milton Fire Hall on Tuesday, Nov. 24.

The boy and girl in the county will be awarded a personal trophy plus a large trophy their school will display in the coming year. Halton contest is designed to get youngsters in the nine to eleven year age group interested in fire prevention. They have to read up on fire causes to be able to draw a

poster illustrating the theme. Fire Prevention in the Home, and we hope the information they obtain this way will stay with them for the rest of their lives.

Plans were also made to hold the Bureau's annual church parade on Sunday, October 4. Firefighters from the five county fire departments will parade to Grace Anglican Church in Milton for the 11 a.m. service. Milton Girls Pipe Band will head the parade, which starts at Victoria Park. This parade is held each fall to draw attention to Fire Prevention Week.

25,000 COPIES

During Fire Prevention Week the Bureau's member departments will be distributing 25,000 copies of their fire prevention place mats to restaurants, hotels and dining rooms around the county. Each fire department will also plan its own local program to mark fire prevention week, and these events will include fire hall open houses, school fire drills, film nights, equipment demonstrations, fire hazard in-

spection and distribution of thousands of pieces of literature.

"Fire Prevention Week is the one week in the year

when we make a concentrated effort to inform the county's residents about the dangers of fire," said Chief Holmes. "Really, every week

of the year should be Fire Prevention Week because prevention of fire is a 365 days a year job for all of us."

In the textile business all his life, he was manager of Wilfred Lavoie & Son in Georgetown for sixteen years, then owner of Lavoie Textiles, Acton.

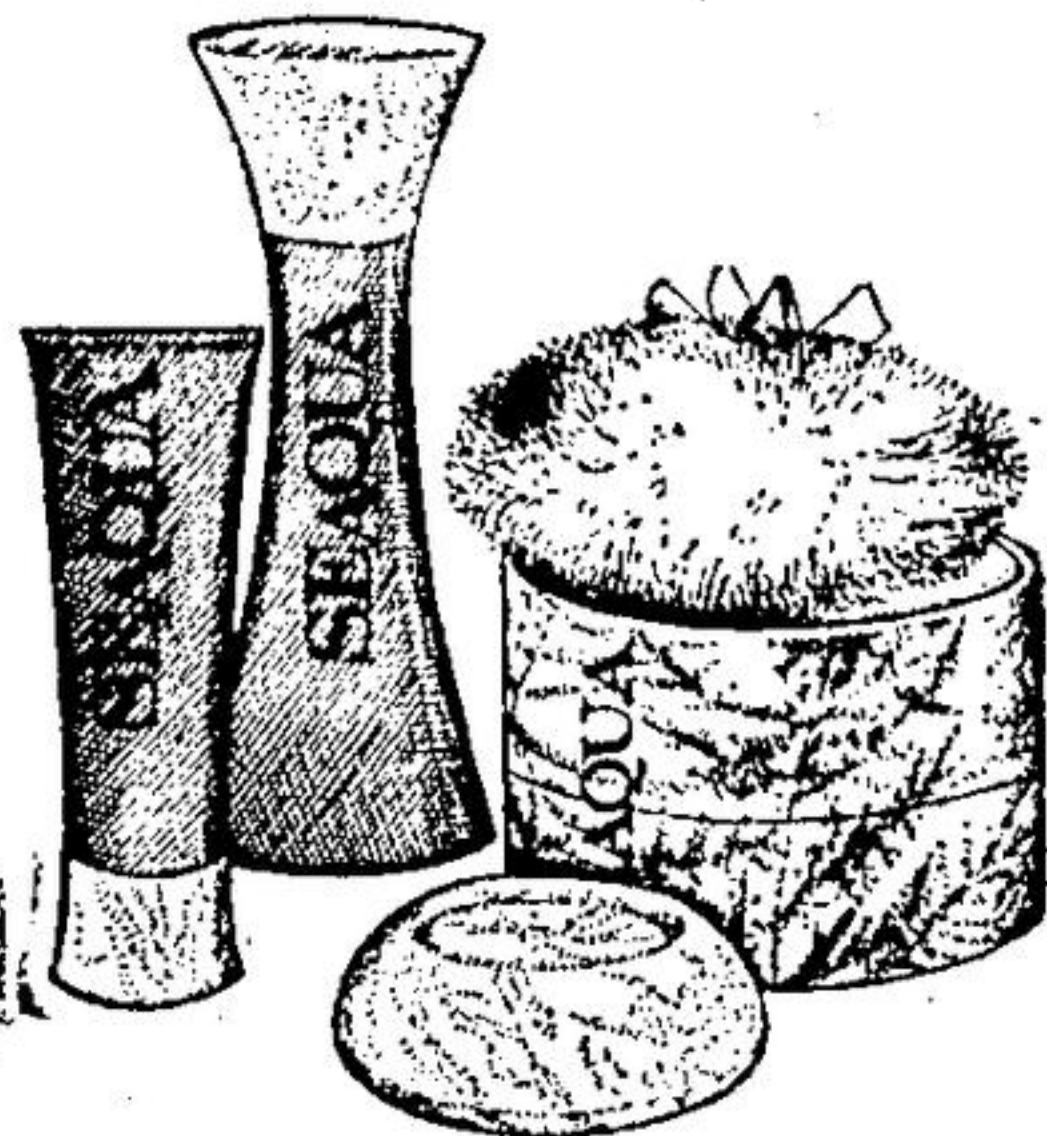
