**Would Revive Central Park Add to Beauty, Recreation**

Older Georgetown residents will recall the days when the 'flats' on the area beside United Co-Op on the highway was called, was the community's main recreation area.

A natural ice arena was there, later there were swings and slides for the children, and boating and swimming.

The recreation area was familiarly known as Central Park.

**SOLD OFF**

Originally decided to be the town in perpetuity by the Lawson family, the park was a depression victim. Portions were sold off, landfill was trucked in and the present Saunders Service station was created beside the highway. Colour waste from the Abitibi papermill added scenic beauty to the creek, which changed colour according to the coating being applied that day, but a strong acrid odour negated the recreation aspect of the park.

Today, with the mill disposing of its waste elsewhere, with modern machinery available to change the course of the creek if need be, and with an emphasis on conservation, there is talk of reviving the park.

**START TALKS**

Monday, Cr. Wm. R. Smith, tabled a motion which found favour with town council to initiate discussions with the conservation authority, recreation committee and any other interested groups with a view to this.

He said it would be a selling point for Georgetown to beautify so central a part of town, where highway travellers now see only dinginess.

He said considerable clean-up could be done without heavy expense, by interesting such groups as Boy Scouts in a project.
