

Fifteen Ontario scholars in a class of 89 graduates made the 1969 graduating class at Georgetown District High School one of the best in history, principal Michael Furlong told those attending Friday's commencement exercises.

The program took place in the new cafeteria before a full house of parents and friends.

Honour graduation diplomas went to the 89 secondary school graduation diplomas set a new record, with 182 students receiving these; there were 11 special commercial graduates, and 22 received Grade 10 certificates of training.

In his remarks to the graduating class Mr. Furlong told them that their days of care-free enjoyment were drawing to a close.

"In a few years you are going to be parents with all the difficult decisions which your parenthood entails," he said. "I hope

you have as many answers when you reach my stage of life as you have today."

He cited the school staff and board of education as doing a superior job and said the quality of teaching and administration in Halton is equal to the best in the province.

Valedictorian Maureen Clarke made some thoughtful remarks about young people and the world they are entering.

She said very few young people are ready to take a stand and prepared to make a sacrifice.

"Man still operates from self-interest" she said. "There is nothing wrong with this if kept in proportion, but when a second car is more important than doing something about starvation it's not so good."

She said young people study social conditions, but 90% of them only deal with them in the abstract, content to let world problems solve themselves.

Parents are not anxious for them to develop social attitudes—they are naturally thinking of their children making a living. Students, in turn, don't want to examine themselves and the issues they face.

"We will be the controlling element in our society," she told her fellow grads. "You do nothing if you don't contribute. It's our world. I hope you care enough to make it a better one."
