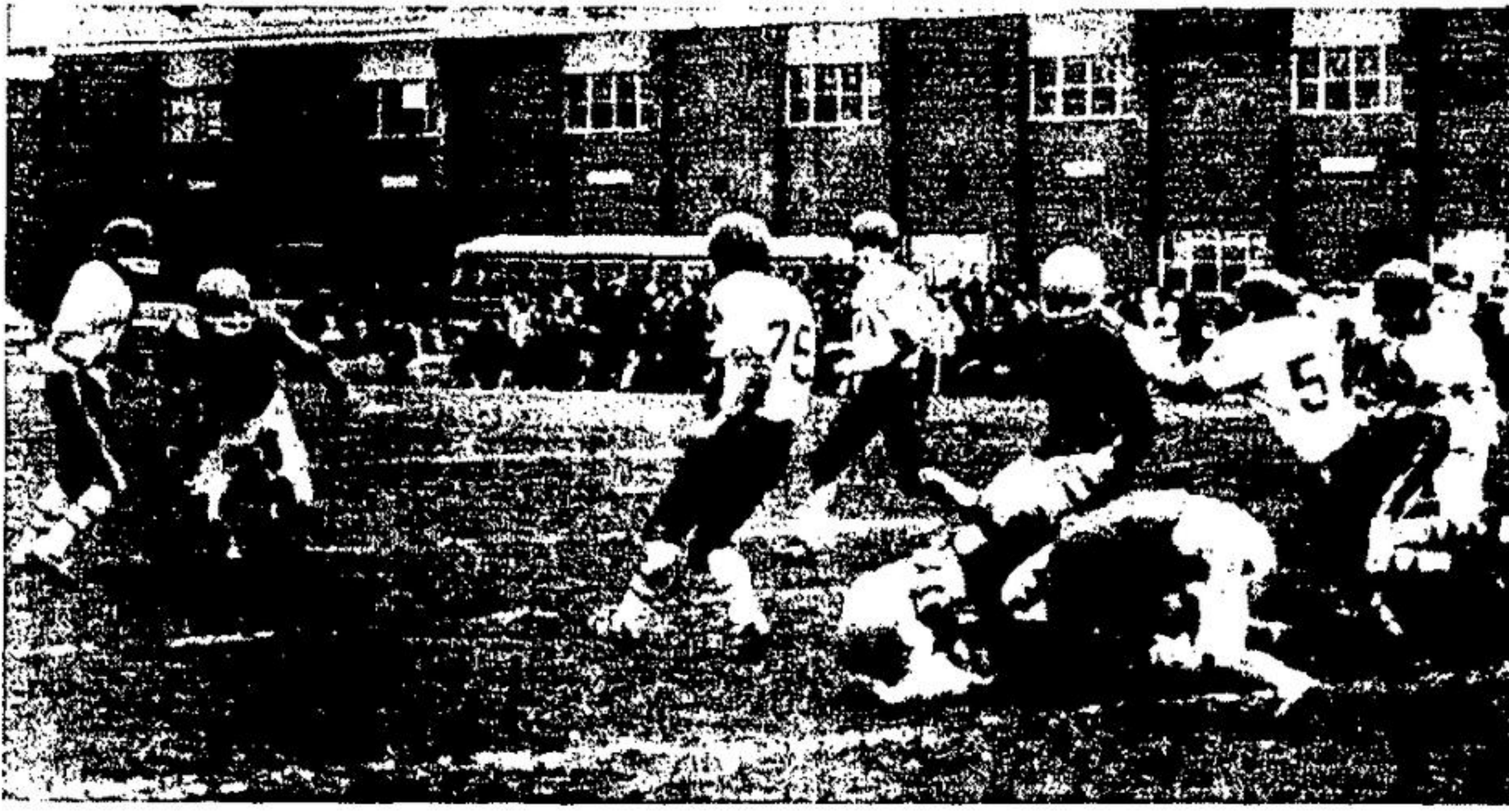


Colts Too Powerful - Win County Crown Over Rebels

Burlington's Central High School Colts out-duelled Georgetown Rebels for the Halton County junior football crown, Friday afternoon.

Colts doubled the score on Rebels with a 28-13 win but by no means did they dominate the game to the extent the score might imply.

Rebels were within striking distance of the Burlington club right up until the last few seconds when they were forced to give up a safety touch and kick the ball from their own 25 yard line.

SHORT - KICK FAILS

The Georgetown club tried the obvious short kick and recovered it but the officials ruled it had not travelled 10 yards. They gave the tactic one more try on the second kick but this time Colts recovered on the Rebels' 30 yard line.

A couple of good runs by full back Joel Peters and a one yard plunge for a touchdown by Craig Tataryn and Burlington put the game out of reach with seconds remaining.

Rebels had fought back in the second quarter to close the Burlington lead to 17-13. Rebels gave every indication that they would storm out in the third frame and overtake their visitors.

However, they just couldn't get an attack generated. The safety by Colts plus the major and conversion in the final minute was all the scoring in the second half.

A FEW BREAKS

Georgetown did have some tough breaks to contend with but regardless of that fact Colts earned their victory.

Fullback Bob Elinesky scored the second Rebels touchdown

and that came after the hosts had been penalized. It appeared Elinesky had bulled over from the one yard line as the officials raised their hands.

There was a flag on the play, however, and the home club was set back five yards for an off-side infraction. Elinesky did it all over again from the six yard line this time.

COACHED BY GOLDSTON
Colts are coached by former Hamilton Tri-Cat and Montreal Alouette Ralph Goldston. If there is any major difference between the two clubs it would have to be Colts' defensive back-

Goldston played in the defensive secondary himself and it was apparent he had particularly given special attention to that spot.

Rebels' quarterback Randy Pope had been enjoying regular success with his passing game for the past couple of weeks. That all came to an end Friday with Colts covering his receivers extremely close.

When Pope did manage to unload a pass, more often than not it was expertly batted away from the receiver or intercepted. Pope was forced to practically abandon the passing attack

and had to go with the running of Elinesky.

ELINESKY GREAT

Elinesky's running left nothing to be desired but with the constant work he had to be tired. He carried the ball six straight times in one sequence for two first downs with every-one in the park knowing who would carry.

Pope scored the other Rebel major in the second quarter and Bob Phillips converted. Colts pivot, Dannie Bovair and Peters also counted touchdowns for the visitors while Doug Perry added a field goal and a single.

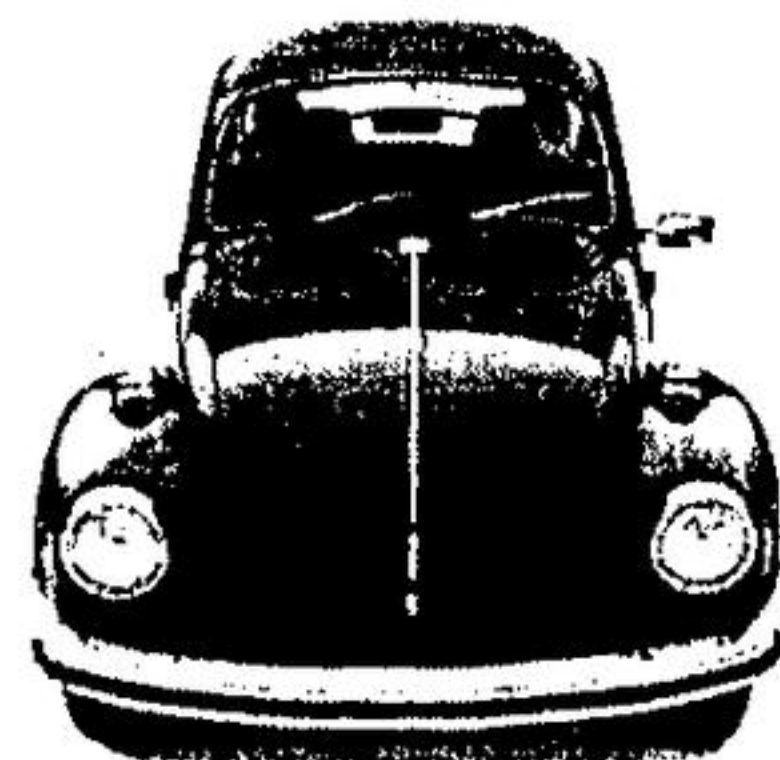
