

Four Rapid Goals Halt Win-bound Raiders

Fort Erie triggered four goals in three minutes in the third period to pull the rug from under Georgetown Raiders in an intermediate A hockey game in the Memorial Arena Friday night.

The Fort Erie outburst enabled them to skate off with a 5-4 victory while Raiders contributed their toboggan ride through the league ranks. It was Georgetown's fifth straight setback after three victories.
