Merchants Organize, Elect Eight to Head Committee

A new merchants' organization, dedicated to working together to make Georgetown an attractive and competitive shopping district, was formed last Wednesday at a meeting at the Riviera Club, Norval.

Those present elected an eight man committee which will guide the association for the next year.

With the aim of bringing merchants together from various

town locations, elections were held on a 'ward' system, allowing retailers to vote only for two candidates from the area in which their business is located.

Members of the new committee are:

Gerry Lang (G/S TV), Mark Hellwell (Eric's Hardware) representing Area 1, east of Mountainview Rd. to the town boundary.

Murray Lawton (Canadian Tire), Bob Voorzanger (A&W Drive-In), Area 2, west of Mountainview to the Guelph-John intersection.

Charles Crimes (Towne Sewing), David Mackenzie (J. B. Mackenzie & Son), Area 3, 'downtown' section.

Gord Collins (Moore Park Texaco), Clare Francis (Mac's Milk), Area 4, Moore Park area.

A general discussion was held following the election regarding issues considered most important for local merchants.

Among these were Christmas store hours, affiliation with Chamber of Commerce and Canadian Retail Merchants association, frequency of general meetings, store hours and the impending entry of Zeller's into the Georgetown area.

The Zeller firm is interested

in locating in Georgetown Market Centre, but has requested a radical departure from the town's present by-law governing hours which demands Monday closing, 9 to 6 hours on three days, and open until 9 p.m. Thursdays and Fridays.

A number of merchants present said that to remain competitive with other centres, an increase in open hours is needed. Several stated that they favour Zeller's locating here,

adding a major retailer to the town.

Opinion of those present was unanimous that Christmas store hours should start December 7, with stores staying open six days and five nights weekly from then on.

Monthly general meetings starting in January, are being planned. The committee was empowered to investigate affiliation with the Chamber and Retail Merchants association.

HEALTH UNIT NURSE

Charges Discrimination Unfounded, Says Warden

A complaint by a member of the nursing staff of the Halton County Health Unit that she has been discriminated against because of her colour was called 'completely unfounded' by Warden Allan Day last week.

County Council learned Tuesday the nurse had complained about discrimination to the Ontario Human Rights Commission.

Inspectors from the commission are investigating the complaint.

Notice of the complaint was contained in the Nov. 9 minutes of the Personnel, Legislation and By-Law Committee,

which were approved by council.

Warden Day would not comment further on the matter, would not name the nurse involved and would not say where the alleged discrimination had taken place or when the complaint had been lodged with the commission.

A spokesman for the Human Rights Commission said that no comment could be made on the investigation other than a public report of their findings would not be made unless the matter goes before a board of inquiry.
