
The accused admitted he had tailgated the car and also that he went over 30 m.p.h. in town.

"If I had known it had been a police officer in front of me, would have stopped," he told


Assistant Crown Attorney Murray Roulston said the accused had admitted to two driving violations and Judge Black agreed he felt this was sufficient to warrant a conviction.




