

GETS \$100 FINE

Sergeant Tailgated By Trucker

A Willowdale man has been fined \$100 for tailgating the private car of Georgetown police Sergeant Frank Arthur.

Acting on his own behalf, the accused pleaded not guilty to a charge of careless driving before Judge James Black in provincial court Wednesday.

Sgt. Arthur told the court he was on his way to work about 7:15 a.m. along Highway 7 and east of Norval when a large garbage truck came up behind him with its bright lights on.

FORCED OVER

Driver of the truck blew the horn several times.

Sgt. Arthur said the truck tried to pass him several times, forcing him to drive on the shoulder of the road to prevent the garbage truck from colliding with oncoming cars.

He said the truck passed his car in Georgetown.

The sergeant took up chase during which the truck came to a stop sign. The chase ended in a new Georgetown housing project where the truck disappeared.

After a short search, the truck and driver were found at the back of one of the new homes. The driver said he was looking for a garbage container which was to have been loaded onto the truck.

WOULD HAVE STOPPED

The accused admitted he had tailgated the car and also that he went over 30 m.p.h. in town.

"If I had known it had been a police officer in front of me, I would have stopped," he told the judge.

Assistant Crown Attorney Murray Roulston said the accused had admitted to two driving violations and Judge Black agreed he felt this was sufficient to warrant a conviction.

NORTH HALTON REPORT

During the week ending Nov. 21, officers of the Ontario Provincial Police stationed at North Halton detachment worked a total of 927 1/4 hours and patrolled 8,976 miles on area roads under their jurisdiction.

Traffic violations resulted in 30 charges being laid while an additional 22 motorists received warnings about minor driving errors. Proceedings in Provincial Court, Milton resulted in 59 convictions being registered.

Officers responded to 23 general occurrences during the 7 day reporting period. Included were — 1 theft investigation; 1 instance of breaking and entering; 1 willful damage complaint; 1 arson investigation and 2 missing person complaints.

North Halton detachment recorded its 8th fatality of the year early Sunday morning when 1 person died as a result of injuries received in a single car accident which injured 2 other persons. Thirteen additional accidents were investigated this week including 4 which resulted in injuries to 6 persons. Total property damage was estimated to be approximately \$7,055. Following investigations 8 charges were laid against drivers involved. Careless driving was the predominant cause of the mishaps; while others were caused by following too closely and failing to share half the road. One collision occurred when a deer ran into the path of a car.
