reeve. He stated he had worked hard and tried to look objectively at all the issues. He said he had brought the Fire Marshal's report with him, and said it was available to anyone who wished to look at it.

Wilfrid Leslie urged that the township grant should be increased from 50% to 60% the "same as our neighbours to the north". He claimed the large number of stone quarries and gravel pits and resultant traffic through the township caused extra wear on the roads. He suggested council should seek this grant. He concluded by saying he would do his best to make Esqueusing a better place to live.

HOW MUCH

Ken Marshall thanked the ratepayers for letting him serve the past two years, and for the fellowship he found on council. He said taxes cannot go up and up. "How much can you pay," he asked.

He claimed this council had worked on regional government proposals to try to get the best deal possible for Esqueusing. "We don't want Esqueusing to be saddled with debt from other municipalities," he added.

He pointed out he was a farmer and businessman, who has a big stake in the area. He said he makes up his mind and stays with it, unless there is a good reason to change. "I don't change with every pressure group," he commented.

BEST USE

William Lawson, returned to Halton County Board of Education unopposed, reported on various activities of interest to North Halkon. He cited the school boundary changes to make the best use of facilities, the use of Pineview school library this summer, when the library was manned by teachers on a voluntary basis.

Lawson stressed the attitude of the school board in opening up the schools for the use of the community. He told of the introduction of oral French in the elementary schools, and the equitable distribution of books in school libraries all over the county. He mentioned the increase in special education classes in the last two years, and the fact that northern students attend voca-

tional classes in Burlington.

THREE POINTS

Malcolm Freeman presented a three point platform, based on unbiased decisions, full township representation and forward planning. By full township representation he said he meant no backing by one specific group, from one specific area. He said the need for planning had been clear years ago. He advocated the proposed garbage dump in a pond at Milton Brick should be thoroughly investigated, since underground streams could be contaminated.

Peter Bowman claimed his interest was basically planning. He also urged the establishment of recreational facilities within the township, so children would not have to travel to adjacent towns. He criticized the conditions of the roads, and concluded by saying he had attended 90% of the council meetings this year.

Len Coxe said he had lived most of his life in the township where he has farmed and operated a painting and decorating business. "I have no axe to grind and no beefs at all," he commented, "I won't make Esqueusing a fine place to live, but I'll try to keep it a fine place to live," he concluded.

LOT OF WORK

J. Elwood Snow admitted he had a lot to learn, and said he would like to start on the council of the township in which he was born and raised. He wanted to continue farming, he said, and felt it would take a lot of work by council to maintain agriculture in the township.

George Maltby stated he was 31, and had lived in Esqueusing for the past ten years. He felt the official plan should be speeded up, so development could be controlled in a sensible and responsible way. He claimed the Ontario Municipal Board asked council to draft an official plan 8 years ago. He said he was concerned about the way tax dollars are spent.

Ward Brownridge said he was an auctioneer and farmer, the 5th generation to farm the property. He felt his long standing interest in politics had been sparked by his late uncle Wilfrid Bird, a warden of Halton County. He criticized a motion banning parking on the 6th Line, but said on the whole he

had little to criticize in the present council.

BRING PRESSURE

Richard (Dick) Howitt, stated he was running because he felt as a lawyer his training and background would be an asset when the official plan was being dealt with. He said he was concerned with assessment. "We are going to be assessed at market value, and people with large acreages will have their taxes skyrocketed." He contended that council should bring pressure to bear on Queen's Park to combat this problem. He admitted his investment in Esqueusing was "a drop in the bucket compared to others," but urged all ratepayers to be concerned about planning.

Reeve George Currie, as is the custom in Esqueusing, gave a final summing up, and answered some statements by previous speakers. He claimed there was less dragging on township roads, since the advent of the Golden Horseshoe Dragway. "You can blame me for any of your problems," he remarked, "because I've been here all the time."

He pointed out that Esqueusing was well managed having no debenture debt. He concluded by warning the group he'd be back in a couple of years "if they didn't behave."

K. C. Lindsay, chairing his last nomination meeting ran a short tightly-controlled meeting, limiting the reeve to 10 minutes speaking time, the present councillors to 5 and the candidates to 3. The meeting finished at 9:45 p.m. the earliest a nomination meeting has closed in many years.
