**It's Off to Russia
For Joe Fobert
GDHS Wrestler**

Georgetown amateur wrestler Tiger Joe Fobert is one of eight wrestlers, all Canadian champions, who leave December 21 to wrestle top Russian Junior wrestlers in Moscow.

Joe, a grade 12 student at Georgetown High School, was selected to make the trip by the Canadian Wrestling Association after his gold medal victory at the Canadian Championships earlier this year.

The Canadian wrestlers will compete in a series of tournaments during the Russian tour.

The team is comprised of Joe Fobert, 105 pounds; Robert Stitt West Hill, 115 pounds; Mike Eddy, Kitchener, 123 pounds; Andy Tashilkowich, Prince Albert, 132 pounds; Mickey LeClair, New Westminster, 143 pounds; Cal Enjollison, Thunder Bay, 154 pounds; Bill Eller, Vancouver, 163 pounds; and Laurie Dean, Scarborough, 174 pounds.

The trip was made possible by Frederick Oberlander, Canada's representative on the World Wrestling Federation, after he came second in the balloting for the Canadian sports executive of the year. The contest was sponsored by Air Canada and the second prize was ten tickets to anywhere in the world for the athletes of his choice.

At the time of the announcement he was attending the world wrestling championships in Edmonton and he immediately talked to the Russian delegates who suggested that a junior tournament be staged.

Only eight wrestlers will make the trip because two of the ten tickets have already been used for delegates to the

Canadian wrestling meeting in Calgary earlier this year.

The two heaviest classes, 191 pounds and heavyweight, will also not make the trip because those two classes have the least number of competitors in the Canadian national championships. Each of the wrestlers is expected to provide his own out fit including slacks, blazer, wrestling gear and sweat suits as well as his own expense money.

Fobert expects that it will cost approximately \$200 but all of the wrestlers agree that it is well worth the money to be able to compete in Russia against their top juniors.
