# Forecast 19 Million in New Schools, Additions

The capital forecast which Halton County's director of education James Singleton last Thursday night emphasized as a tentative one for the board's perusal, sets out a five year capital budget of \$10,225,000.

However, there is no provision for funds for a new administrative building. The board has to move out of its current Oakville facilities and is enlarging the Burlington offices to accommodate the board as of July.

A capital budget does not include operating expenses. Capital expenses are such things as new buildings, additions to buildings and equipment.

REGION AGAIN Because of the possibility of regional government, the board does not want to spend any large sums on new facilities now.

### NEW PUBLIC SCHOOLS

The \$10,225,000 forecast suggests the board budget for three new public schools, a new high school and provision for seven other school facilities. The forecast also included a number of additions to existing schools.

The \$10,225,000 forecast includes \$10,425,000 for public schools and \$8,800,000 for secondary schools.

The new board will deal with this proposed forecast at its first business session on January 28.
