## AMERICAN MOTORS HAS ONE DAY HALT

American Motors (Canada) Ltd. halted production Friday in a one day shutdown to reduce inventory.

Friday's shutdown follows week-long production halts in the fall of 1970 and prior to that in the spring of 1970.

A company spokesman said a further shutdown will go into effect January 18 and will last a week.

He said the production halts were part of a plan by the company to reduce assembly line speed to bring the number of new cars manufactured in line with the number shipped from their stock.

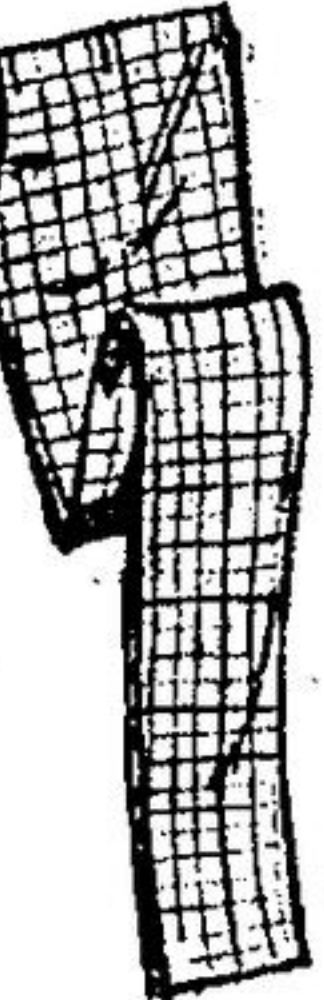
