### ERRORS

Under commission regulations there is no way the welfare people can collect the money they have paid the recipient while he was waiting for his unemployment cheques.

### COSTS THOUSANDS

Gray says this delay by the unemployment commission is costing Halton County taxpayers thousands of dollars.

He says it normally takes two weeks for unemployment insurance benefits to be processed and sent to the recipient. The burden of having to pay unemployed people welfare while they wait for unemployment cheques helped put the social and family services agency budget about \$100,000 over the allotted \$420,000 for general welfare assistance.

## 15 Sideroad Residents Decry Horse and Buggy Road

Upset by what they refer to as horse and buggy roads a group of residents living on or near 15 Sideroad have made it clear they want improvements on the sideroad.

About 14 residents gathered recently to post a mock sign at the corner of Highway 25 and 15 Sideroad which reads "Carriage road ahead. Use at your own risk. Speed 7 MPH — It's your life."

After posting the sign those who had gathered there discussed the road and the many problems they had found with it over the years.

### SHOULD BE FIXED

Arnie Miller of R.R. 1, Georgetown travels the road three times daily during the week, driving a school bus. "A lot of the turns are bad and ought to be fixed. It is bad on the Nassagaweya side too," Miller said.

The road runs from the Guelph Line through Nassagaweya and Esquesing Townships as far as Stewarttown. The road formerly maintained by the two townships is now a county road and has been the subject of considerable discussion at the county level.

### FEAR DESTRUCTION

Residents living along the road in the two townships have mixed feelings about the road. Some feel the road has to be fixed to provide safe passage, while others fear it becoming a major route and disturbing the scenic beauty of the rural area.

Al Brown, who lives on the 4th line and uses the road often said the road wasn't bad in the horse and buggy days but the way it is now, someone is going to get killed. "The road is a death trap," he said.

Both Nassagaweya and Esquesing Township councils have pushed for a public meeting with county road officials to have the problem aired. A meeting is expected in the near future.
