

No Solid Vote For P-C Leader

Halton East MPP Jim Snow said last Wednesday the Halton East delegates to the Ontario Progressive Conservative party will be on their own with no direction from the riding association.

He said that a recent decision of the riding association executive to mail preferential ballots to party members had been scrapped because of a shortage of time.

Snow said since most of the detailed policy statements from leadership candidates will come close to convention time the ballot, which would have to be mailed out by February 1, would not be of much value.

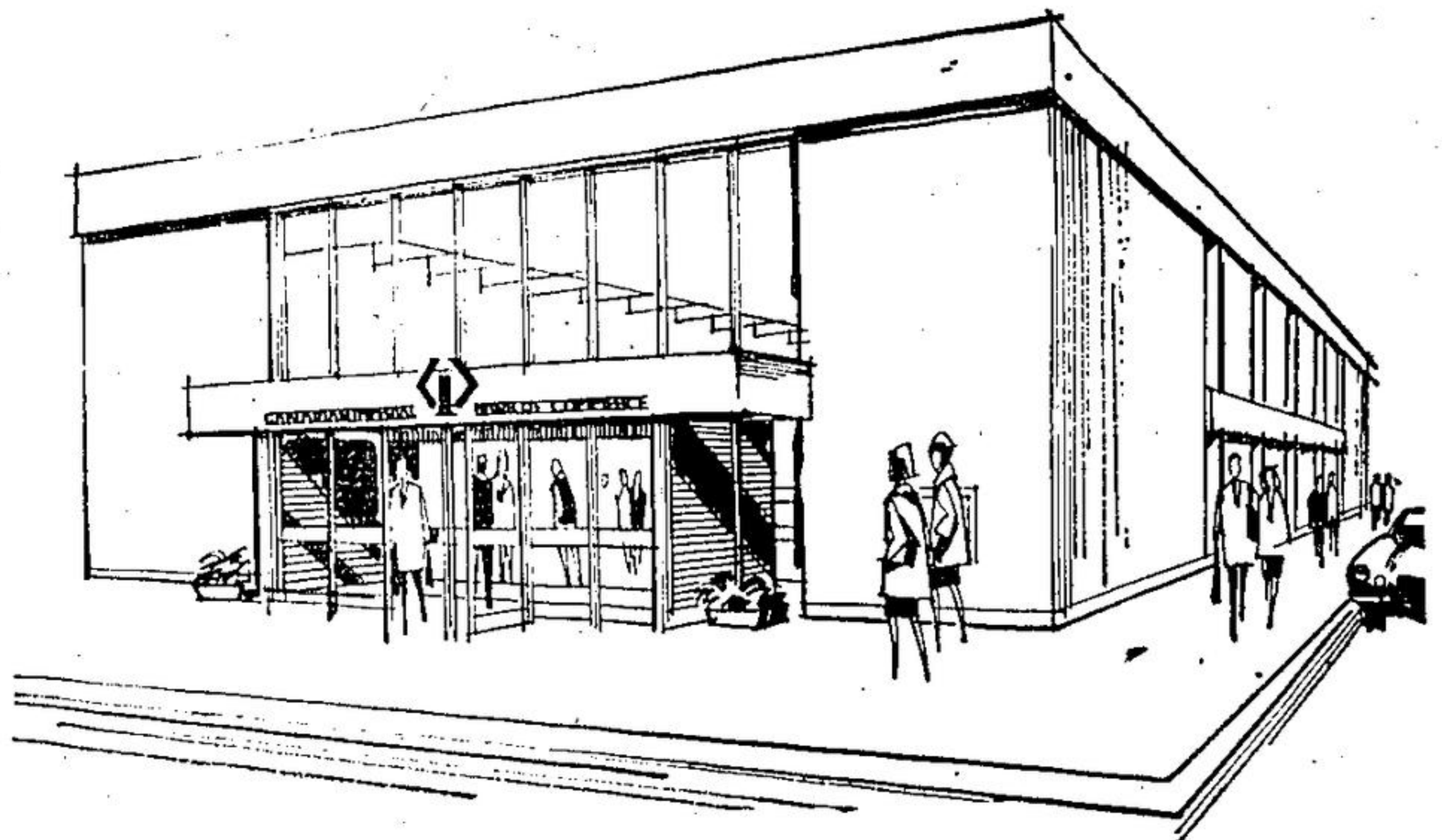

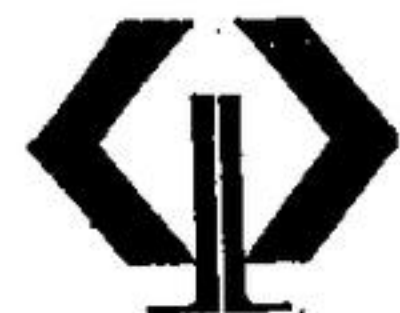
