

# Senior Basketball Rebs Win 2 of 3 Starts

After two pre-season exhibition games all three Georgetown High School basketball teams looked capable and promising. The season officially opened for the Rebs on January 8 with a Friday night triple header at home with the visitors being the White Oaks Wildcats from Oakville.

The opening game started at 6 o'clock with the Midgets.

It was action right from the opening jump. But it ended up in a heartbreaking defeat for coaches Pete Lavell and Bob Leo with the final score being 40-38 in favour of White Oaks.

The junior game was equally exciting but once again defeat was in the hands of Georgetown with the final score being 42-34 in favour of White Oaks.

Then the seniors took to the floor and they showed White Oaks why they intend on dominating the senior division of this league. The game was full of excitement and action and Georgetown came out on top 49-32.

The top Rebel scorer was Gig Blalock with 11 points.

## AT PERDUE

The next Rebel game was on Wednesday, Jan. 13 at Perdue with all three teams in action again.

The Midgets lost another close one, to Perdue by a score of 50-36.

The juniors just couldn't seem to get moving and they fell to the Junior Perdue Panthers by a score of 70-43.

Once again our seniors kept right on rolling along in the victory department by thumping the senior Perdue Panthers 80-38. The leading scorer for the game was Colin Foster with 30 big points for Georgetown.

That gave the senior Rebs a 2 wins and 0 losses record going into Friday night's home triple header against Blakelock on January 15.

The student body showed up in full force to support their teams.

## AT BLAKELOCK

The Midgets came out looking for revenge and started out as if they were going to get it. But they just seemed to fall apart as the game grew older with the final score 42-36 in favour of Blakelock.

It was a happy night for coach Ron Hicks and all the members of the junior Rebs when they finally put everything together and defeated Blakelock 53-49 for their first win of the season. The top scorer for the juniors was Peter Landale with 15 points.

The senior Rebs were the team who couldn't get their point offence working. Against the starting five of Blakelock who were all over 6 ft. it was difficult to get anything working at all. The final score was Georgetown 49 Blakelock 66.

The next home game isn't until Friday, Jan. 29. It's a double header starting at 7 p.m. with only the Midgets and juniors seeing action as the visitors from Milton have no senior entry.

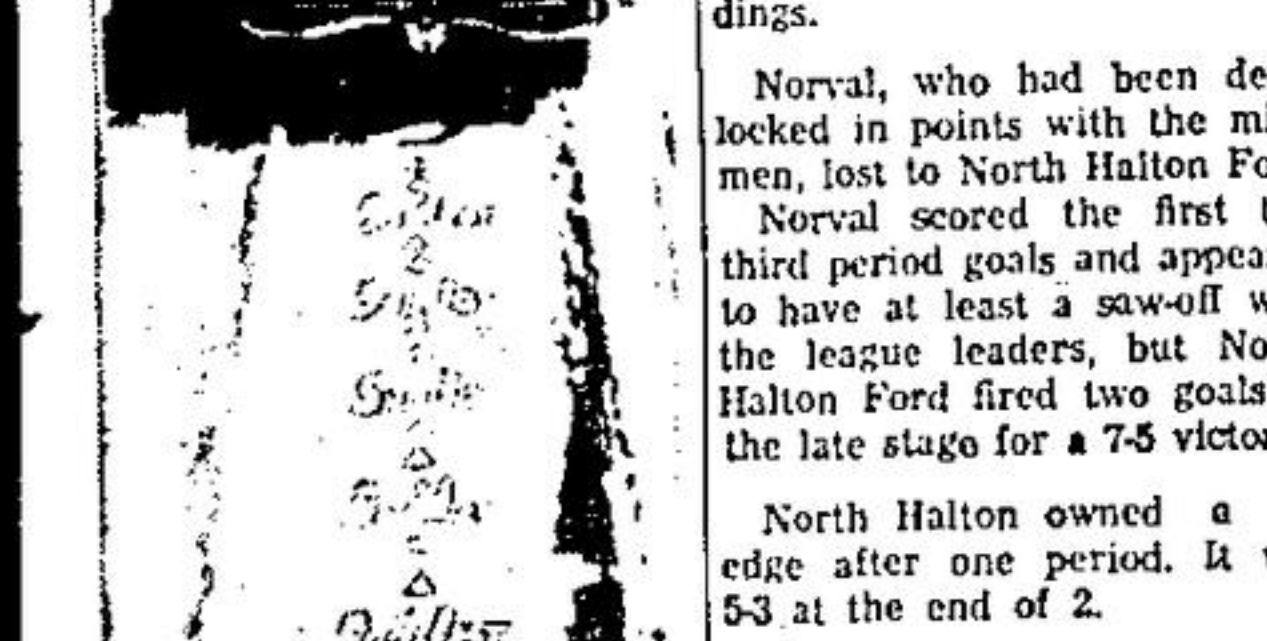
North Halton owned a 4-1 edge after one period. It was 5-3 at the end of 2.
