ESQUESING Council Briefs
● Esquising council on Monday agreed to raise its mill rate for roads by 1.5 mills this year, meaning the road mill rate will be 10 mills.
At the same meeting:
● Esquising council will proclaim the week of February 21 to 28, Scout and Girl Guide Week in Esquising.
● A copy of a letter from the Department of Municipal Affairs to engineer W. H. Carr, said the approval for a subdivision on lots 24 and 25 Concession 7, was withheld until an official plan and regional development program were set out.
● The clerk was instructed to prepare a by-law setting up four interim tax payments during the year. The due dates of tax instalments will be May 15, July 15, September 16 and November 16. One per cent interest will be charged on all overdue instalments and 1% interest on all arrears from past years.
● When Harold Ritchie, an outspoken critic at last meeting of the township's winter control program, was asked if he wished to address council, he replied "I did when I came here, but after listening I see they are not men around this table, but just a bunch of boys."

Choral Society Revival Now in Planning Stage
Revival of a choral society in Georgetown is being planned. Recreation director Doug Colison has called a meeting in Cedarvale Community Centre next Tuesday for people interested in joining such a group.
Charles Crimes and Ralph Ussel who have been active in musical circles, have volunteered to assist in its formation and to lend their directional and accompanist talents to the organization.
Always noted for its musical talent, Georgetown had an active choral group in the forties which was led by the late W. E. Capps of Brampton.
There is much musical talent in town, Mr. Crimes told The Herald, and he is enthusiastic about a revival of interest in this phase of community affairs.
"You don't have to be a soloist" he said. "Anyone who can carry a tune and like to sing will be welcomed."
