

Annual Meeting Told Fall Fair Success Despite Wet Weather

Financially the 1970 edition of the fall fair was a success as shown by the treasurer's report at the annual meeting held in Stewarttown Hall on Thursday evening.

The work of the society is not new for the incoming president as he held the office in 1958-59. Garfield McGillivray who spent 15 years as secretary and 4 years as president of the fair retired at the end of last year and this position will be taken over by Mrs. Milne.

Stuart Hall, president in 1969 and 1970 declined to stand for re-election, feeling that the position should not be held too long by one person. The board expressed their regret and thanked Mr. Hall for his efforts on the part of the board and appreciated by the exhibitors who came a considerable distance.

Don Wingrove was returned as second vice president and the firm of Walter Pope as auditors.

Mrs. Charlotte Ironside will continue in the position of treasurer.

Bill Allison was added as a new director, and five new names were added to the associate directors: Robert Taylor, Edward Bird, John Brander, Jack Reed and Ken Milne.

Grants to the Agricultural Society last year included \$1,000 from the province; \$500 county; \$250 town and \$200 from the township of Esquesing, and other donations and advertising amounted to \$2,850.

Receipts totalled \$9,636.62, expenditures \$6,749. of this amount \$3,850.04 was paid out in prize money, the balance went for ribbons, judges, affiliation fees, administration and other expenses necessary to carry on a large operation.

Second Old Age Home Not in County Plans

No plans are being considered for building a second Halton old age home in south Halton.

Warden Dr. F. G. Oakes confirmed there would not be a second rest home after last week's meeting of county council.

SHELVED

Several years ago, a committee was formed to discuss the new home but no decision was reached because of expectations that a Halton Provincial government might be formed. Since then plans for such a government have been shelved.

It still is possible Burlington with a population of more than 35,000 would be put into a Hamilton-centred region, thus taking away many potential occupants of the new home.

POLICY

Present county policy stipulates senior citizens, if county subsidized, must reside at the Manor located in Milton. If there is no space, they can be accommodated in private nursing homes at county expense, until a Manor bed is available. When a bed is available, the senior citizen is immediately transferred to the Manor.

Dr. Oakes and Manor committee chairman Esqueting Reeve Tom Hill said there is no bed space at the Manor now. At least three people are being temporarily housed in Oakville's ultra-modern Extension care.
