**RED CROSS GETS \$4000.  
FOR HOMEMAKER SERVICE**

A \$4,000 grant to Georgetown  
and District Red Cross to es-  
tablish a homemaking service in  
North Halton has been made by  
county council.  
Deputy Reeve Arthur Speight  
conveyed the good news when  
he attended the Society's an-  
nual meeting last week.  
He said that as a county coun-  
cillor he was delighted to have  
been able to help the home-  
maker service get started. It  
has been in the planning stage  
for three years.  
**GOOD WORK**  
Mr. Speight paid tribute to  
the good work of the Red Cross  
since its inception here in 1939.  
Through war and peace, it has  
fulfilled an important and nec-  
essary function, he said, and  
the homemaking service is an-  
other milestone.
