#### RED BADGER

With a little knowledge of materials and previous experience with the other easier-totie flies one can very easily tie the red badger streamer.

A 3 x long or 4 x long shank hook, with a straight bend in limerick style I believe is best. The tail is made up of bright red hackle tips, two is best,

ribbing is of medium silver flat tinsel, and the body is bright red seal fur spun on a section of thread that has been treated with sticky liquid so the seal fur will stick when spun around the thread.

Four matched badger hackles are selected and tied on form a wing in sort peak - roof style. The wings should extend out to the end of the tail.




