Here's How to Put Snowmobiles to Bed



As the snowmobiling season draws to a close, it's time for every owner to consider a little TLC - tender, loving care - for his machine. As with any mechanical product, just a little simple minor maintenance often will prevent major expenses for repairs and parts replacement. Fortunately, minor maintenance and adjustment of these machines can be accomplished easily by the average owner - without special tools or skills. For detailed instructions, owners should refer to the manual received with their machine at the time of purchase, but general recommendations can be given here: Fuel system - clean or replace any filters in the fuel tank or lines. Throttle - apply a dry lubricant to the cable, and check the system from thumb throttle to carb for proper tightness of all fittings. Brakes - on most machines there's a simple adjustment to compensate for wear of the brake band. Drive belt - replace if there is excessive edge wear, or at the first sign of cracks. Track - make certain tension is equal on both sides, per your manual's instructions. Of course, if you still suspect you'd be "all thumbs" even after reading your owner's manual frequently take your machine back to your dealer for checkups - he's an expert at TLC for snowmobiles!

No Objections Sweepstakes Ticket Selling
