How do you get so lucky? It wasn't easy. They had to work for it. Applicants were first screened by their leaders and group committees and then passed on to the election board for final decision.

TESTED ON HOSTS

The selection board was made up of Chris Bridge, Eric Balkind, Doug Williams, Peto Lavell, John Stopper and the Rev. Walter Ridley of Norval, who asked them questions based on their knowledge of their community, their province and their country. And, finally, they

were tested to see just how much research they had done on their host country.

The World Jamboree is being held just outside Osaka, Japan. The Canadian contingent will be together in one section and will be living in tents, getting their food from a central supply depot and cooking it themselves.

\$900 PER BOY
Boys from all across Can-

ada will meet in Vancouver for a two-day pre-camp to acquaint them with Jamboree conditions. Then they will fly to Tokyo for two days and then on to Osaka.

It costs \$900 for each boy to attend the Jamboree and this amount is split three ways: Georgetown District council contributes \$300, the boy's group committee underwrites \$300 and the parents pay the final \$300.

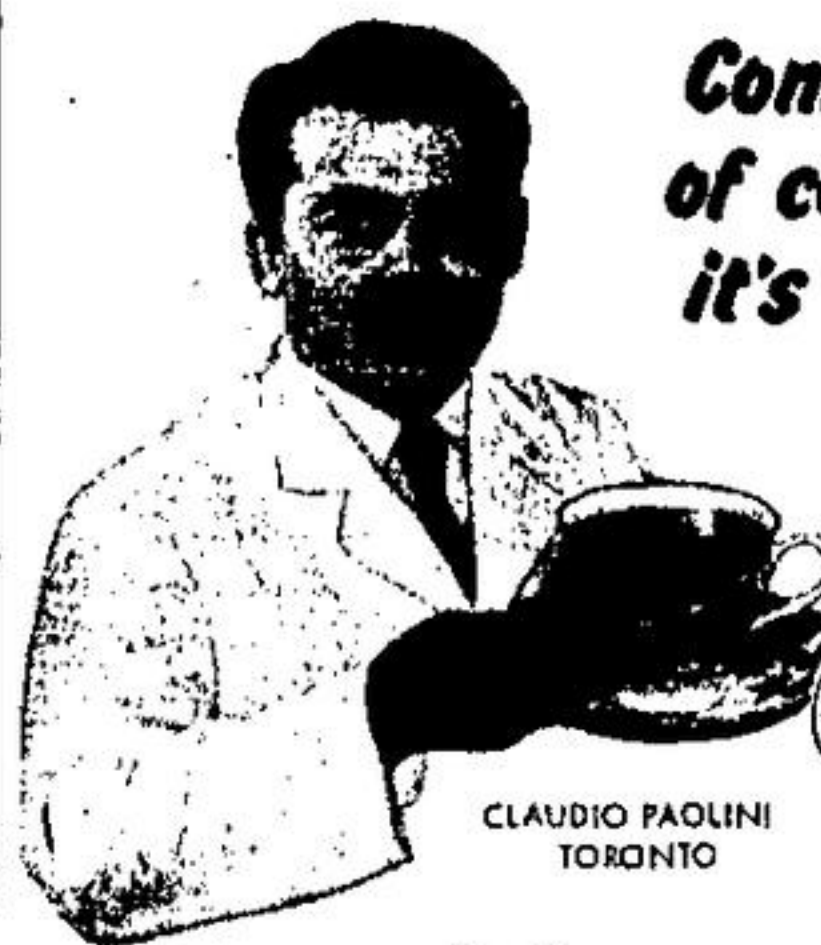
