## \$246,000 Road Project Slated for Mountainview

The first part of engineering and construction proposed in the Halton Roads Needs Study will begin this summer, says county engineer Jack Corbett. The most costly piece of work this year will be rebuilding a half-mile stretch of the Guelph Line in Burlington.

It will cost Halton \$316,000 to rebuild the road running north from the Queen Elizabeth Way. Included in this will be the installation of traffic lights and lighting standards.

### REST IN '72

"I think work on this project will begin in June or July and it will be contracted out to a private firm. Rebuilding of the rest of the Guelph Line up to Highway 5 will be done in 1972 and 1973" Corbett says.

A stretch of the Derry Rd. between the Fourth and Fifth Lines in north Oakville will be rebuilt this summer at an estimated cost of \$118,300.

Included in this will be property purchases and a widening of the road.

### WIDEN BRIDGES

Two bridges on the Base Line Rd. (Steeles Ave.) just west of Hornby will also be widened to 30 feet at a cost of \$44,000. They are presently 20 feet wide.

The fourth major project this summer will be engineering do-

sign and properly acquisition along the 7th Line from the hamlet of Drumquin to Highway 401.

This work will cost an estimated \$79,900 and Corbett says construction will probably begin in the summer of next year.

### MOUNTAINVIEW

The last major project to be undertaken during 1971 will be the reconstruction of Georgetown's Mountainview Rd. and to rebuild this one mile stretch will cost the county \$246,000.

All these projects are included in the study which is a 10 year plan setting out a system of roads which could provide the nucleus of a regional roads system.

### PAY HALF

The first five years of this program will cost \$10 million. An estimated \$2 million work is to be done each year and half of the cost will be paid by the Department of Highways.

The other half will be funded by the county and each of Halton's seven municipalities will be levied according to assessed population.

Oakville and Burlington will pay 82 per cent of the total cost of the work.

### 21 MILES

The study involves a county takeover of roughly 21 miles of road from municipalities. In turn, Halton would return 14 miles to the municipalities.

ville's Winston Churchill Blvd. and Upper Middle Rd., until the county knows definitely where Burlington stands in regional government.

Corbett had said earlier the roads taken over south of the Highway 5 would also mean too massive of reorganization of his department for implementation at present.
