# Halton Sportsmen Pushing For Deer Hunting Season

Halton's various sportsmen's associations are pushing for Halton County to set up a deer hunting season.

There has been no such season since 1967.

Spokesman for the group, Jim Etherington said the associations are asking for a three day season every other year. These three days could run consecutive or every other day, he said.

GET CLOSE "We are also asking that shotguns only be used so as a hunter has to get up fairly

close to the deer before he can make a clean kill." "This will prevent high powered rifle bullets flying through the bush," he said.

"If we don't have a season, it could get to a point where the conuty will have such a weak strain of deer they would not be the pretty animal everyone associates with the breed." STUNTED
