The Georgetown Citizens Band may disband, council heard Monday night, when a long letter from band president Dave Hastings pointed out the lack of interest in its existence.

The letter said only five members turn out regularly, to the poorly-lit and sometimes unheated rehearsal room in Cedarvale. No adults seem interested in playing band music, said the letter and no interest comes from high school students.

Talks to Rug Hookers On Tie-dying, Batik
 At a recent meeting, the Georgetown Rug Hooking Guild had as their guest speaker, Miss Estelle Post of Toronto. Miss Post, who does a considerable amount of work in crafts, for Metro schools, gave a demonstration of tie-dying and Batik, and a talk on the concept of colour.

By folding cloth and tying off small sections before dipping them into the dye-pot, many different and often vivid patterns can be produced. For Batik, a design is first applied free-hand onto the cloth with warm wax, then the cloth, which can be previously tie-
