CARS COLLIDE AT NORVAL 4 CORNERS
Highway 7 was the scene of four out-of-town accidents last week.
On April 1st at 1 p.m. a tractor trailer and a road grader collided on Highway 7 north of 22 Sideroad. The tractor trailer driven by Glen Duncan of Brampton, received \$100 damage, but the township of Esquesing grader, driven by Mervin White of Georgetown was not damaged at all.
Again on Highway 7, this time on the Norval hill by Willow Park, a 1964 Pontiac driven by Peter Vanderwerf of Guelph collided with a 1965 Austin driven by Hans Grimm of Toronto. \$100 damage was done to the Pontiac, and \$90 to the Austin.

PROPERTY DAMAGE ONLY IN 2 ACCIDENTS
There was \$750 chalked up in property damage but drivers and passengers escaped unscathed from two automobile accidents investigated by Georgetown police within the week.
Just prior to noon on Saturday, cars driven by James B. McLean of 88 McIntyre Crescent and James Goodlet of R. R. 3, Georgetown collided on Mill St. opposite the entrance to the downtown parking lot resulting in an estimated \$200 damage to Goodlet's 1966 Cadillac and \$150 to McLean's 1969 Camaro.
A police report said Goodlet was westbound and McLean eastbound when left front fenders hit in the westbound lane.
HIT AT PLAZA
A rear end collision at the eastern exit from Georgetown Market did \$250 to a car operated by Joseph Games of 68 Marilyn Crescent, and \$150 to one driven by John Stevenson of Clarkson, last Wednesday night.
Both cars were leaving the plaza when Stevenson's 1969 Chev struck the back of Games' 1969 Mustang according to police.
