Beta Sigma Chapters Mark Founder's Day

The Georgetown Chapters of Beta Sigma Phi will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the organization's founding.

Forty years ago, the first chapter was formed in Abilene, Kansas. There are now approximately 9,600 chapters, and over 200,000 members in the United States, Canada and 24 foreign countries.

In addition to the Founder's Day Banquet, traditional ceremonies will be observed. The history of the local chapters will be reviewed and the new members will receive their first welcome to membership.

A message has been sent from the president in the International Headquarters and a member from each chapter will be selected by the individual presidents to read this message. It will be the central event of the evening and the culmination of the program.

Bodnar at Park School

Unit, Pupil Cost Basis Of Spending on Schools

All spending on schools in the county are based on a per unit cost, and per pupil cost, trustee Ernie Bodnar told Park Parent School Association, last Wednesday night.

He said it was the only way to have control of the finances and stay within the guide lines set down by the provincial government.

He said the policy of the board regarding school sites set the size at 5 to 6 acres for a junior public school, 7 to 8 for a senior public school and 16 to 18 for a secondary school. "If a park adjoins the school site the limits would be dropped by roughly two acres," he added.

GRANT RAISED
The unit cost applies also to audio-visual and field equipment as well as school supplies said the speaker.

He pointed out that the provincial grant had been raised

from 50.51¢ last year to 54.88¢ this year, an amount he guessed would be the maximum Halton would receive. He said Georgetown's mill rate for education would rise ½ mill this year.

He reminded the audience that Halton County Board had managed to stay within the limits set by the government.

"The ceiling for ordinary expenditures is \$345 per pupil at the elementary school level, and our figure is \$346.53. Similarly at the secondary school level the per pupil expenditure was \$974.33, while the ceiling was \$1,060. The total budget for this year amounts to \$39,806,241," said Bodnar.

FEW FRILLS
The main reason the general county mill rate is down 1.94 mills is simply because the province gave us more money, said the trustee.

"However other boards who received as much couldn't hold the line," he remarked.

He said the board, when originally set up, curbed its tendencies to do everything right away. "We couldn't keep up to the very best in the county, but we averaged it out, so we are in pretty good shape," he concluded.

During the short question period he explained that costs were kept down by not indulging in too many frills, or trying to offer too specialized programs. He said the northern area was being upgraded by the addition of gymnasiums, and library resource centres which other schools already had before the county system.

SCHOOL AT LIMIT

William Firth, in the audience questioned Bodnar on frills, and suggested one of the reasons students were dropping out was the academically oriented classes, which offered no manual dexterity.

In reply Bodnar pointed out that many shop courses are offered at Georgetown as options so students can take both academic and shop courses.

In answer to another question regarding the merits of schools as large as Georgetown High school, Bodnar said small schools could not offer the diversity of courses since it would be uneconomical. He suggested Georgetown high school had reached its limits and would not be extended.

Earlier in the evening Grade 5 and 6 choir under the direction of Mrs. Ruth Forgrave entertained the gathering.
