

# Georgetown Nurse is Supervisor North Halton Homemaking Service

ONTARIO DIVISION — Several Georgetown delegates attended the 51st annual meeting of the Canadian Red Cross Society Ontario Division and workshops on Thursday and Friday April 15 and 16, in Hamilton. The Hon. Richard T. Potter, M.D., M.P.P., Minister without Portfolio of the Province of Ontario, will be the guest speaker.

BRANCH — A nurse, Mrs. Laney Brands of 5 Hale Drive was selected as a part time Red Cross Homemaking Service Supervisor. The final decision was made by the Director of Homemaking Service of the Ontario Division. Mrs. Brands will look after the Homemaking Service for North Halton County, which will cover Esquesing and Nasagaweya Townships, Georgetown, Milton, Acton, etc.

HOMEMAKER SERVICE — Homemakers will be needed in the different areas. They will get a Red Cross training and on the job they will wear a Homemaker uniform and they will be equipped with a special bag, holding first aid and other handy articles.

MINOR DISASTER — Immediate assistance, in the form of clothing, shelter, bedding and food was given to three families who were in recent fires.

CARE IN THE HOME EDUCATION — The class had their tests on Wednesday, April 14 and graduation was last night.

FRIENDLY VISITING — Visits will be made now to shut-ins of all age groups. Mrs. Ruth Poullos will be heading this program; she has done similar work in Ottawa.

SERVICE FOR SENIORS — Chairman Mrs. Pauline Hughes is taking a letter under study, outlining the Federal Government's Youth Employment Program suggesting that services for Senior Citizens could be supplied by local youth with the Government underwriting labour costs.

WATER SAFETY — Mrs. Linda Clapham, Water Safety Chairman and Mrs. Connie Nieuwhof, attended a special Ontario Divisional Water Safety Meeting in Hamilton on April 14.

BLOOD DONOR CLINICS — The next clinic has been planned for Monday, June 7, at the Holy Cross Church Auditorium.

INDIVIDUAL EMERGENCY AID — Volunteer drivers took patients to and from clinics. This committee is very busy providing layettes and other necessities to young mothers and needy families. The Rebekah's Women's Institute, IOE and the Y leaders group will try to assist this committee in their task by supplying the layettes. A place to store these and other emergency items is a necessity now and a request has been made to get space at Cedarvale.

LOCAL COUNCIL OF WOMEN — Mrs. Poullos will be affiliated member for the Georgetown and District Red Cross Branch.

LOAN OF SICKROOM SUPPLIES — 133 articles were given on loan over 1970.

CAMPAIGN — \$5,200. were collected during the March Red Cross Campaign-for-funds. Most of the industrial returns are not in yet. As the weather conditions were bad at the beginning of this campaign moneys came in very late, so that an earlier report would not have give a true picture.

## Esquesing Council Briefs

Angelo Sonya, who operates a nursery school in Milton, at present, asked Esquesing council Wednesday for permission to operate the school on Lot 5 Concession 4.

Mr. Sonya told council his lease expires at the Milton site on July 1st, and he plans to build on 8.9 acres he owns. It will be discussed in committee.

Esquesing Township employees have a new vacation with pay schedule. An employee who has worked between 9 months and 3 years, receives 1 week's paid vacation, after 3 years there is 2 weeks paid vacation after 7 years, 3 weeks paid vacation, after 15 years, 4 weeks paid vacation, and after 25 years, 5 weeks paid vacation.

Esquesing council accepted the Planning Board's recommendation deferring designating Ken Marshall's land near Highway 401 as industrial until a definite proposal is put forward.

Council told Mrs. Leona Beadle she did not need to come to council for permission to open an antique shop in Norval, since the three villages are exempt from the holding by-law.

Richard Howitt and Reford Gardhouse were appointed to the County Planning Association, by the Planning Board, council was informed.

RESIDENTS IN THE TOWNSHIP OF ESQUESING

### EXCERPT FROM THE DOG TAX & LIVE STOCK & POULTRY PROTECTION ACT

Revised Statutes of Ontario, 1960, Chapter III:

WHEN DOGS MAY BE KILLED:

10: ANY PERSON MAY KILL A DOG:

- (a) That is found killing or injuring live stock or Poultry.
- (b) That in a Township or Village is found between sunset and sunrise straying from the premises where the dog is habitually kept;
- (c) That is found straying at any time, and not under proper control, upon premises where live stock or poultry are habitually kept.

R.S.O. 1960, c. III, s. 10; 1965, c. 33, s. 5
