Georgetown Police Department's activity report for the month of March has been released.

It shows 11 break-ins, 11 thefts of goods valued at over \$50 and 14 under \$50. Charges

laid totalled 240, and parking tags 56.

Fines imposed totalled \$1,662, arrests 29, and summonses issued 96.

In all 338 complaints were investigated and 97 property checks made, 20 of which were insecure.
