It's 17 Sideroad For Trucks Until New Bridge Is Built

The 4th Line and 17 Sideroad will remain a truck route until the railway bridge at Limehouse has been replaced and No. 22 Sideroad brought up to Class A standards by Halton County.

Esquering council agreed to this in committee over the objections of Cr. Dick Howitt, who made it known at council last week he had opposed the motion.

The County Road Committee earlier this month asked the township to keep the 4th line and 17 sideroad as a truck route.

THREE CHOICES

Reeve Tom Hill told 17 sideroad resident Duilio Marcolini council had given it a lot of thought and had been left with three choices. First was to designate the 3rd line, and 22 sideroad to Highway 25 the truck route; second was the 4th line and 17th sideroad and third was throwing the township wide open and let the trucks go where they please.

"That would be utter chaos," replied Marcolini, referring to the third choice.

"I'm glad you see that," said the reeve.

45 Jobs for Students In 'Operation Sweep'

The Halton Region Conservation Authority has been allotted 45 jobs to be given to summer student help, general manager Murray Stephen announced last week.

The jobs, which have not yet been filled, are part of the provincial government's Students Working in an Environmental Enhancement Program, or SWEEP for short.

CLEAN UP Premier William Davis announced the program in the throne speech delivered several weeks ago.

"The students, either boys or girls, must be 18 years of age and over," Stephen said.

"They will be involved with environmental clean up in the watershed served by our Authority. The students will also be working in our various conservation areas, cleaning up the parks or nature trails," he added.

40 LABOURERS

Applications for the positions must be sent to the Provincial Department of Energy and Resources Management, Queen's Park, Toronto to be pointed out.

"We will employ them from June to September and we'll need a senior supervisor, four foremen and 40 labourers. The supervisor will make \$2.50 an hour, the foremen \$2.25 an hour and the labourers \$2 an hour," Stephen continued.

"They will work an eight hour day, five days a week," he said.

IMPROMPTU DUMPS

"The five senior people will probably be university or community college students who have had experience in this type of work before," Stephen went on.

"They will be cleaning up roadsides and streams and the Authority will also be locating areas where unauthorised dumping has taken place and we will send the students there to clean it up," he said.
