**ESQUEJING TRUCK ROUTE**

The route to the 3rd line to 22 sideroad to highway 25, which she said had few homes. "Do you have the power to make the trucks go a certain way?" she asked.  
"Yes, we can if we want to," replied Cr. Howitt.  
"Do you want this subject tossed back and forth again like it was last year?" asked deputy reeve Russell Miller. He pointed out the only thing to do since it was now a truck route was to improve the road to make it safe. "Limehouse had the same problem and when the bridge is fixed they will have it again," he commented.

**BACK AND FORTH**  
Dick Looe, of the 17th sideroad, suggested the township was contravening its own holding by-law by making the road a truck route. He claimed it was a change of land use, which the by-law forbids.  
"There was pressure from one side and pressure from the other, and you went one way one night, then the other way the next night," he stated.

Reading from lengthy notes, he quoted statements of various councillors at last year's meetings claiming they were contradictory. Answering one of the quotations suggesting the use of the 4th line north to highway 7, deputy reeve Miller challenged him on the cost of cutting down the hill and widening the road, and pointed out there was no extra money from the Department of Highways for a development road. "There's just as many residents of the 4th line north to highway 7 as there is on the 17th sideroad," he shot back. "We can't be more concerned with taxpayers in one area than another," he added. "I'm tired of hearing people saying 'these people on the 17th sideroad are sure making fools out of council,'" he retorted.

**BIG TAXPAYER**  
Dick Looe reminded the deputy reeve he had made the original motion to make 22 sideroad to highway 25 the truck route.

"Okay I admitted I made a mistake, I don't like sitting here on trial" replied the deputy reeve.  
Looe contended the ratepayers were not being considered, and suggested it was an infringement of their civil rights, "the right to peace and quiet," he termed it.  
Cr. Len Cove said they were considered every night. "We are prepared to fix the road but not shut off industry. If I had to go six miles out my way to get to my job, I'd be unhappy," he remarked.  
Cr. Wilfrid Leslie reminded the group Indusmin is a big taxpayer who employs a lot of men. "These are public roads for everyone," he commented.

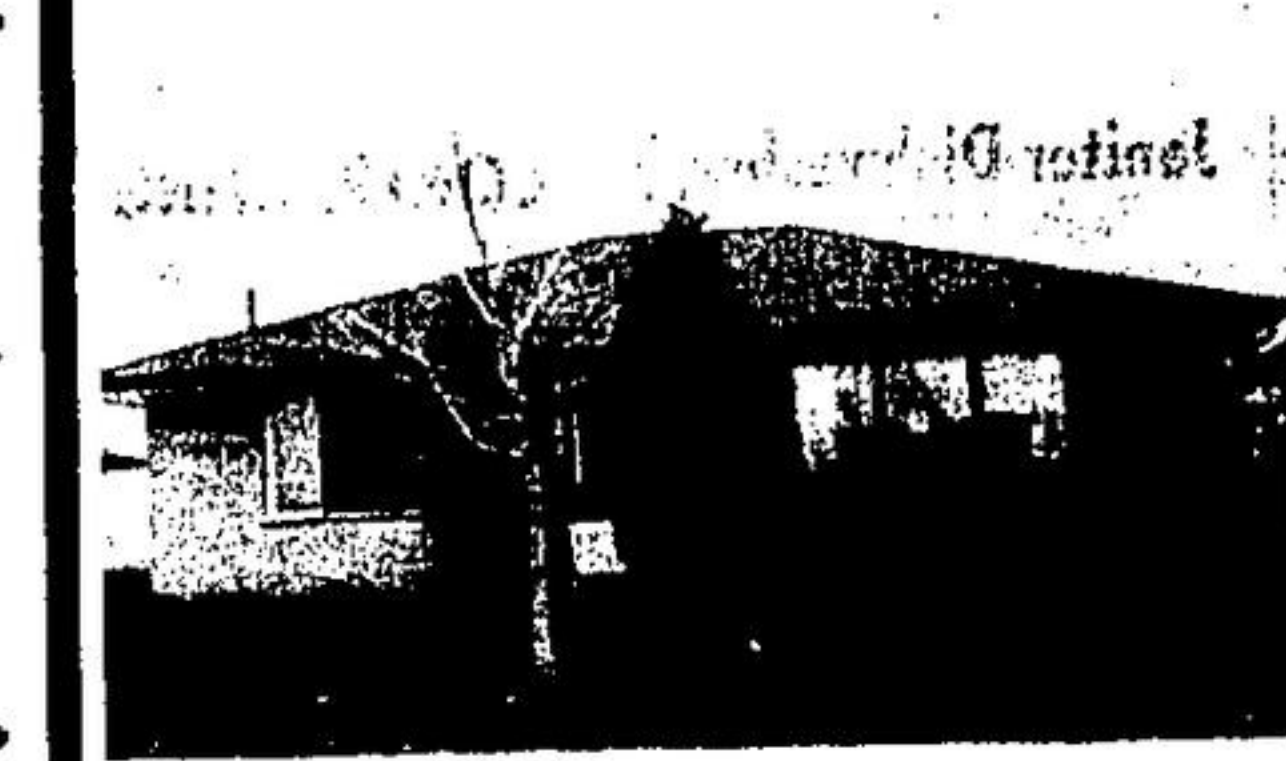

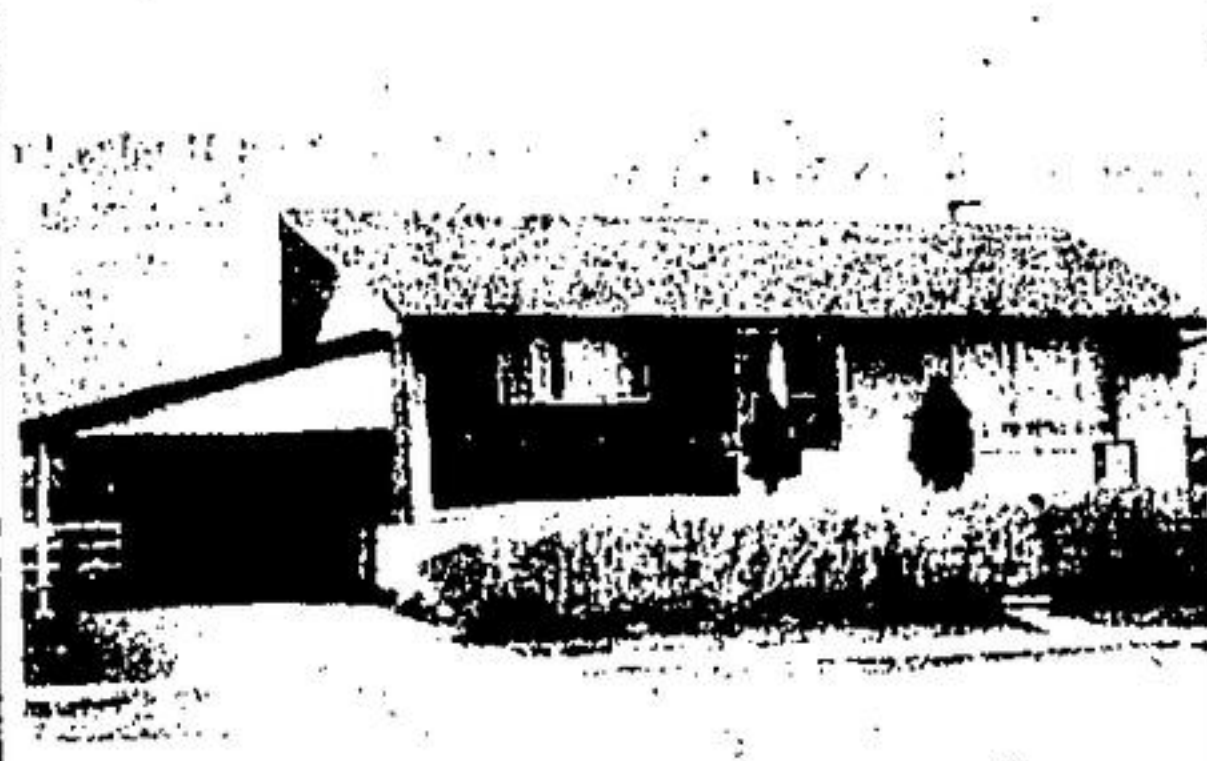
