Consolidated net income of Domtar Limited for the first 3 months of 1971 amounted to \$1.3 million or 9 cents per common share, as compared with \$4.2 million or 28 cents per common share for the corresponding period of 1970. Sales and other income totalled \$120.3 million, an increase of 6% over the \$113.4 million total recorded in the first quarter of 1970.

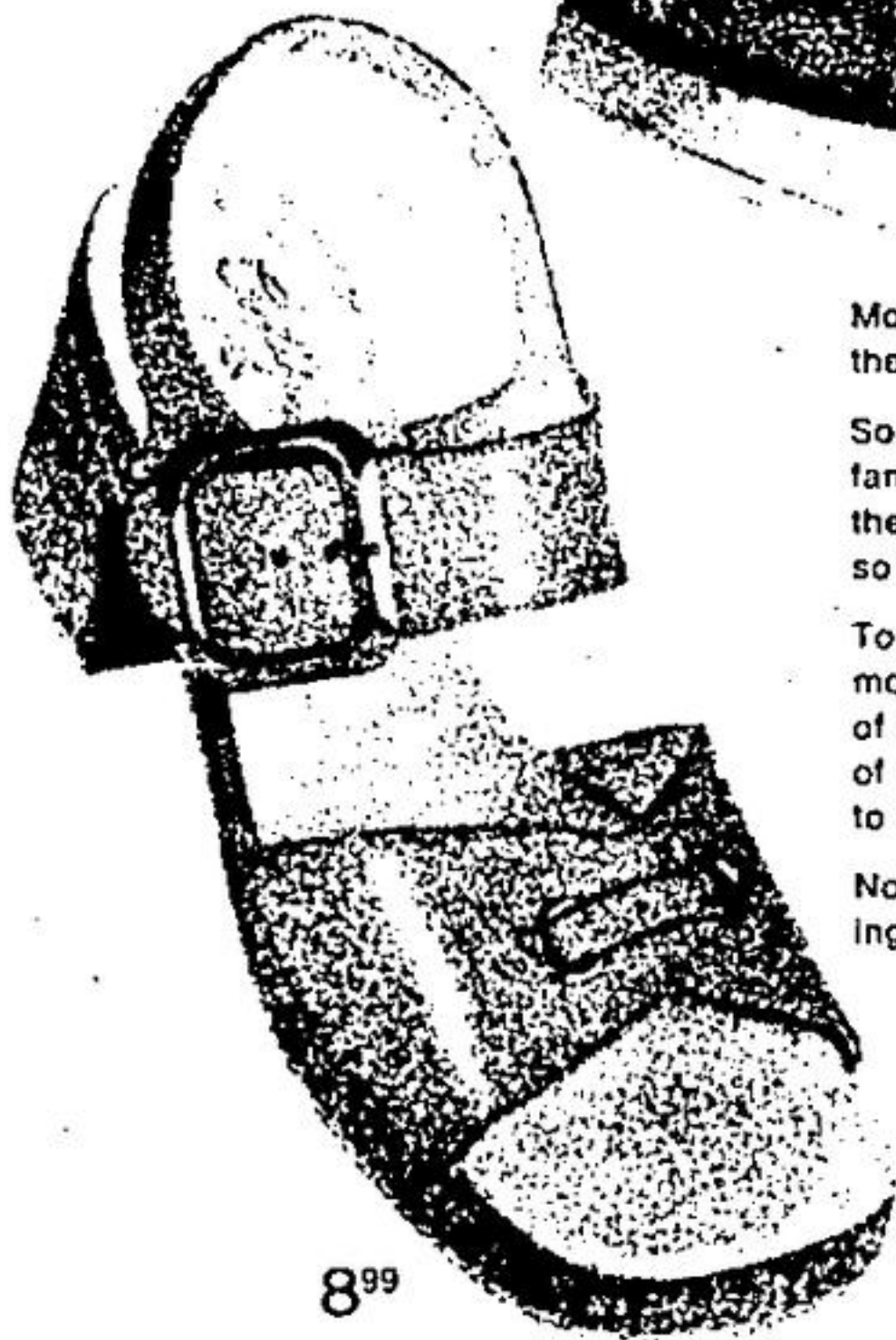
CASH FLOW
Cost of sales and selling and administrative expenses amounted to \$108.8 million during the first three months of 1971 compared to \$98.1 million during the same period in 1970.

Cash flow during the first quarter of 1971 was equal to 53 cents per common share compared to 69 cents in the 1970 period.

Would you like to meet interesting people in the beautiful surrounding of Kelso to help the Halton County Museum? Then "Friends of the Museum" is the club for you! This auxiliary has been in existence only a year and is happy to welcome new mem-

bers. It raises money for the Museum by organizing social activities there. Many people from Georgetown attended the 'Festival' at the Museum last June sponsored by the Friends. You will remember the fashion show, open-air art show and sale, square dances, strolling singers and musicians, and old-fashioned dress competition. FRIENDS ANNUAL

The first annual meeting of the 'Friends of the Museum' was held Thursday evening, April 22 in the committee room of the Halton County Administration Building, Milton. Among those present were last year's executive: Mrs. Gordon Agnew, Campbellville, president; Mrs. Gordon Gowland, Milton, vice president; and Mrs. William Clarkson, Milton, secretary-treasurer. The members voted in favor of two new plans: membership fees and zone chairmen.

This year there is a membership fee of \$2.00 per family. For young people wishing to join on their own there is a student fee of 50c. All paying members will receive a membership card; and their names, addresses and phone numbers will be taken so that an accurate membership record will be on file.

Every town and township in Halton County will have its own representative on the executive. This zone chairman — with the help of telephone committees etc. — will keep the local membership informed of executive decisions and club activities.

The highlight of the annual meeting was Mrs. Agnew's presentation of \$200. to Museum director Dr. H. J. Newman. This money was raised by the 'Friends of the Museum' last year, and will be used to help with the reconstruction of the log cabin on the Museum grounds this summer.

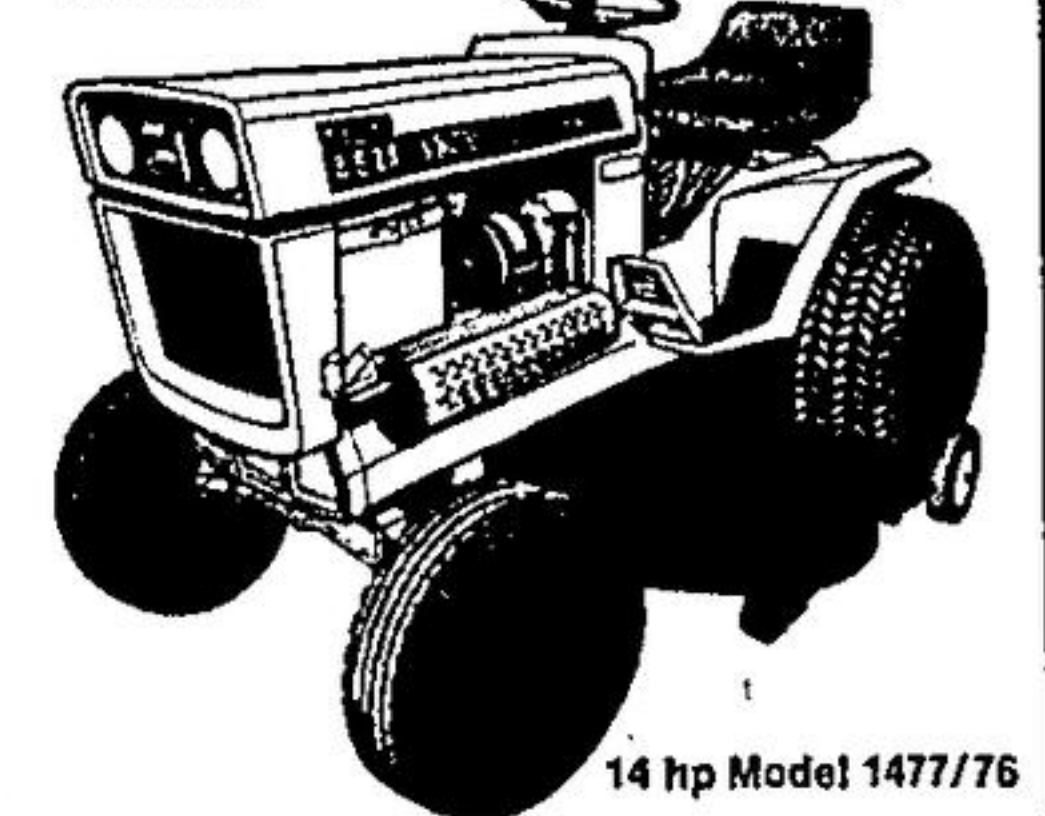

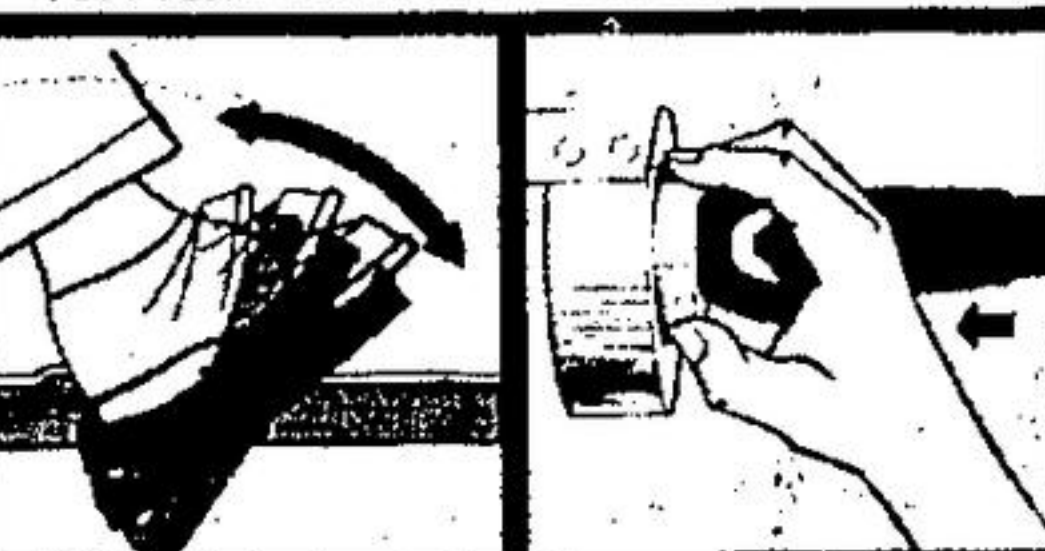
