I knew someone who spent some time in a prisoner of war camp where he had all his toe nails pulled out. He used to walk like that. When she tried to run that's when I started to cry.  
I think it's marvelous that these children want to put themselves through this discomfort for no personal gain. I think it's wonderful that children like this one have the guts and will power to walk thirty miles, but why weren't her parents with her? Why hadn't they been at a check point, to give her a rain coat and dry boots?  
I feel it is up to everyone to help in some way to combat poverty in the world but it is not fair to the children to submit them to this ordeal when they do not always realize that the limit of their endurance has been reached.

**Mushroom Cannery  
Plan Gains Approval  
Of Town Council**

The cannery to be built at Meadow Glen Growers, will come no closer than 310 feet to Mountainview Road, according to a draft agreement read at committee meeting, Thursday night.  
The agreement is the result of discussions between the town, the growers and the residents of Mountainview Road.  
**EXTENSION**  
The offices spanning the full width of the building, will be of clay brick, with a hip roof, wooden shingles and tinted glass windows.  
Later an extension will be built at the rear of the office building.  
**NO GROWING HOUSES**  
No mushroom growing houses will be built there, and no further extensions made. In addition the agreement stated there would be no compost piles.  
The company undertook to plant 10 ft. high screen planting plus shrubs and evergreens, between cannery and Mountainview.
