BICYCLE ACCIDENTS CAN BE PREVENTED ! Here are some tips from the Ontario Department of Transport. MAKE the evening of the 15th in the SURE THE BIKE FITS THE CHILD. A youngster on a bike too big for him is five times as likely to be involved in a colli- auditorium. sion as one on a bike of the proper size. The ball of his foot should reach the ground comfortably from a scated position. MAKE SURE YOUR CHILD KNOWS AND OBEYS THE RULES OF THE ROAD ... Cyclists must obey traffic signs and must signal their turns, stops and lane changes . . . and NO STUNTING OR SHOWING OFF in traffic. MAKE SURE YOUR CHILD'S BIKE IS IN SAFE MECHANICAL CONDITION. Nuts should be tightened, moving parts lubricated. For after-dark driving, the blke must have a front light and a red reflector or light on the rear; plus reflective tape . . . red on the rear fender, white on the front forks.
