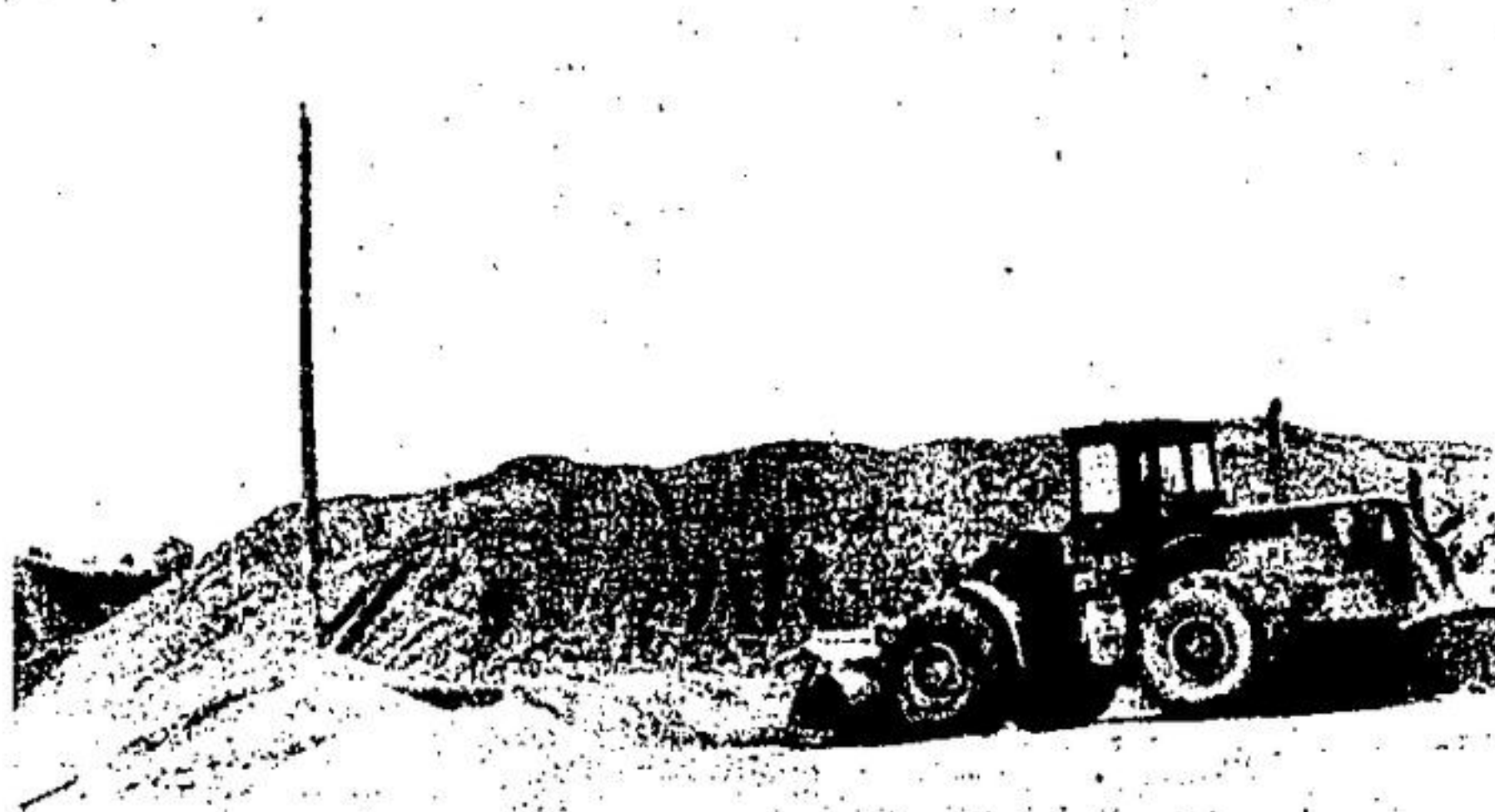


# Pit Site Could Someday Be Recreation Beauty Spot



Indusmin Quarries near Limehouse could become a recreational, industrial or residential complex.

Plans have been drawn up for eventual rehabilitation of the 800 acre site.

Halt County roads committee this week heard a long-range proposal for Indusmin Quarries to turn its pit site near Limehouse into a recreational, industrial or residential complex.

Professor W. E. Coates, landscape professor of architecture at the University of Guelph, has designed plans for eventual rehabilitation of the 800 acre Indusmin quarry site.

His designs have been approved by the provincial department of mines.

**LARGE LAKE**  
The plans call for reforestation of the pit as well as a large lake in the quarry's southwest corner which would be used for recreation facilities.

"Frankly speaking, I do not know of any other producer as concerned about rehabilitating land as Indusmin," Coates told the committee.

**SEEK DIVERSION**  
Indusmin is seeking Halt County approval to divert 22 Sideroad which now runs through the middle of the quarry site. The diverted road would skirt the area the company plans to quarry.

No official request came from the company, but the committee decided to meet with Indusmin officials and Esquesing township council, in whose municipality the quarry is located.

**ONLY PORTION**  
Besides diverting the side road, which is a county road, Indusmin also wants to divert the north-south Third Line, a township road, to the west of the quarry.

Only a small portion of the quarry site has been mined. It is in the northeast corner of Indusmin's property and not yet close to the two roads they want diverted.

**DIAGRAMS**  
Through a series of diagrams Professor Coates explained to the township council, if the road diversion is not approved, he said

the company would be forced to dig around the two roads, which intersect almost in the centre of the unmined part of the quarry site.

**TUNNELS**  
Tunnels to allow access under the roads to the company's crushing plant in the northeast corner of the pit would also

have to be built, he said. Indusmin is planning to try what he termed a radical departure from conventional pit operations, Coates said.

The firm will mine strips running out from the northeast corner of the pit and put back excess earth in the strip previously mined. Once the en-

tire pit is mined out, he said, there would be a large area suitable for development.

**LARGE GOUGE**  
Coates admitted there would be a large gouge in the land, running to 100 feet in depth in places after the quarry operations is completed.

Their plans also showed areas of reforestation in the pit as well as a large lake in the southwest corner which would serve the recreation facilities.
