I read with interest that the route of the old "radial" railway is to be opened up as a walking trail between Acton and Guelph. Many Herald roaders are probably unaware that the radial or CN electric rued to run from Guelph to Acton, Georgetown, Huttonsville, Mesdowvale, and into Terento (Keele Street).

There is a lot of delightful wooded country between Georgetown and Meadowvale and Acton; most of the old radial line is now a hydro right of way and it would seem logical to try and make a walking trail out of it in the Georgetown area before it is closed off for

A few years ago the hydro right of way in the Delrex subdivision was closed off when householders whose lots border The tenants for the new stores the right of way extended their back yards back to the line of the hydro poles. I can see that it might be very difficult to 'reclaim' this part of the hydro right of way as a walking trail but I see no reason to hesitate in establishing the rest of the route as a walking trail as soon as possible; as far as the Georgetown - Mendowvale section is concerned, I would think that this comes under the jurisdiction of the Credit Valley Conservation Authority.

> I think this would be a good time for our local representative to the CVCA to bring the matter up and see if parts of the route can be opened up for walkers this year.




