Debt Interest Boosts Separate School Rate

Georgetown Separate School mill rate is higher than the rest of the county because Georgetown brought a debt of \$120,000 into the Halton County Separate

School system, Dr. Leno Braida, chairman of the Board told a ratepayer, at last week's meeting. Braida said the debt had been

carried on the books for two years at 8% interest. "It was not deemed equitable to saddle other boards with the debt," said the chairman. He stated

the Department of Education had finally decided to pay one third of the debt each year for three years, but the town incurring the debt would have to pay the interest.

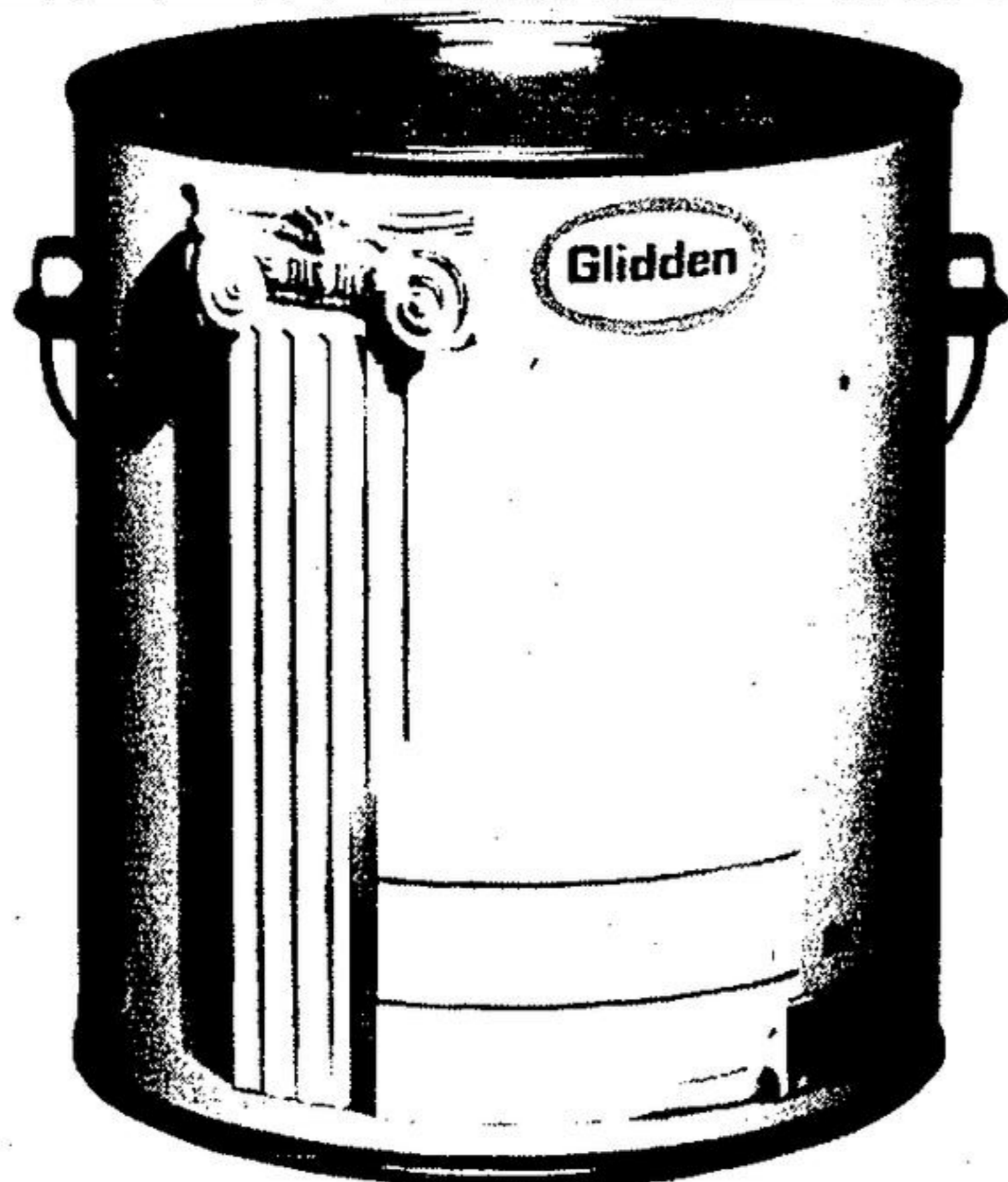
DIFFERENT RATES

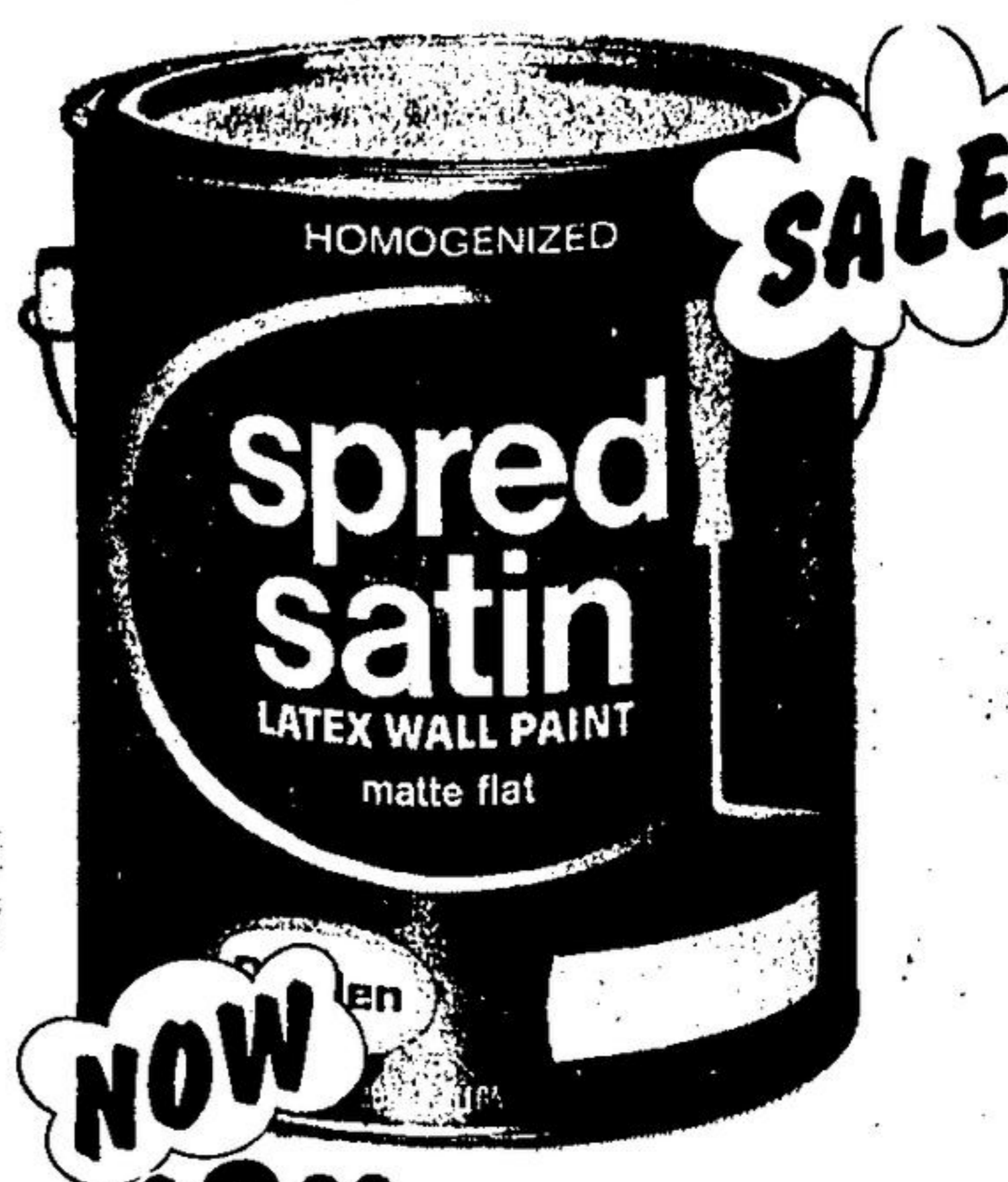
