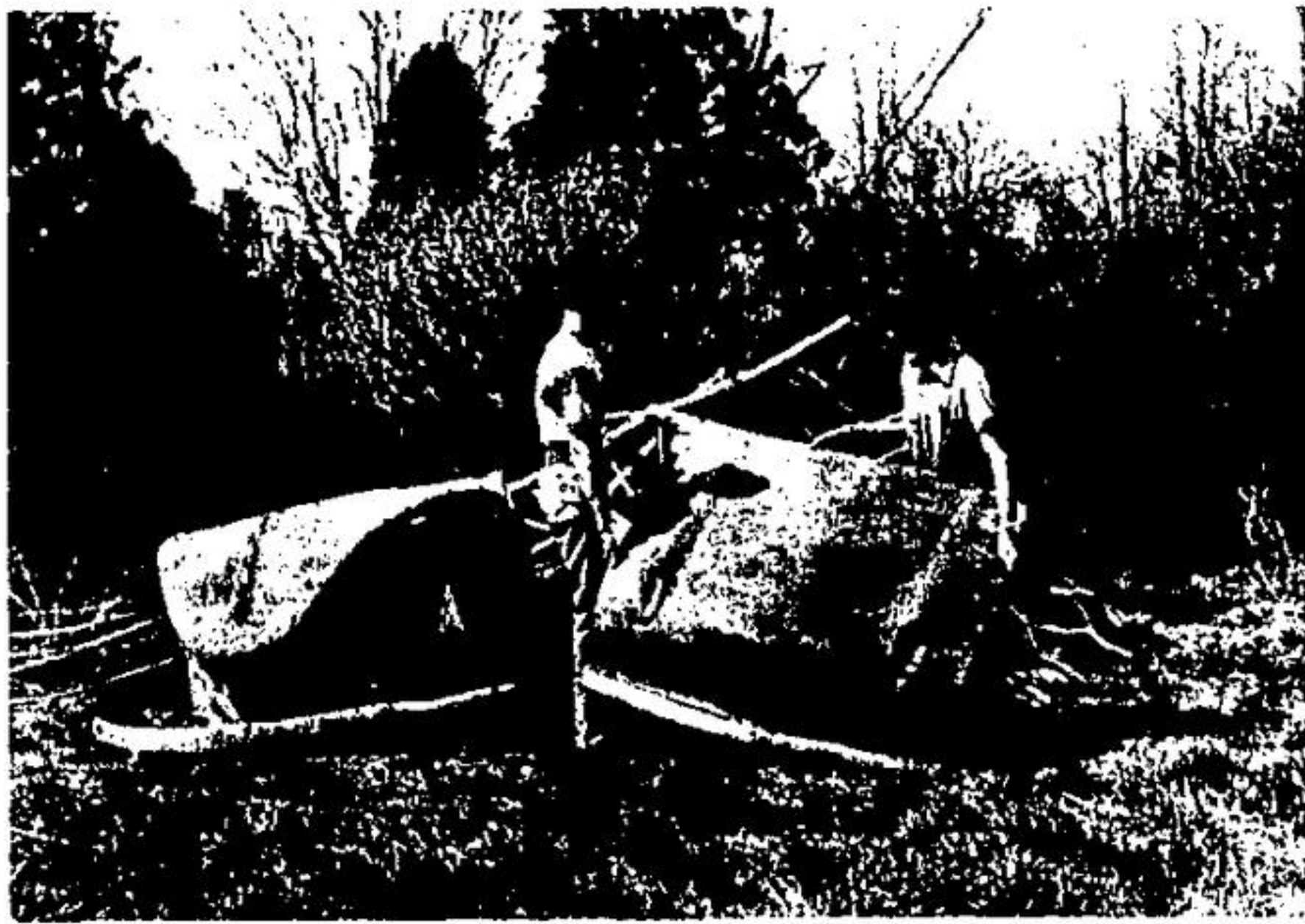
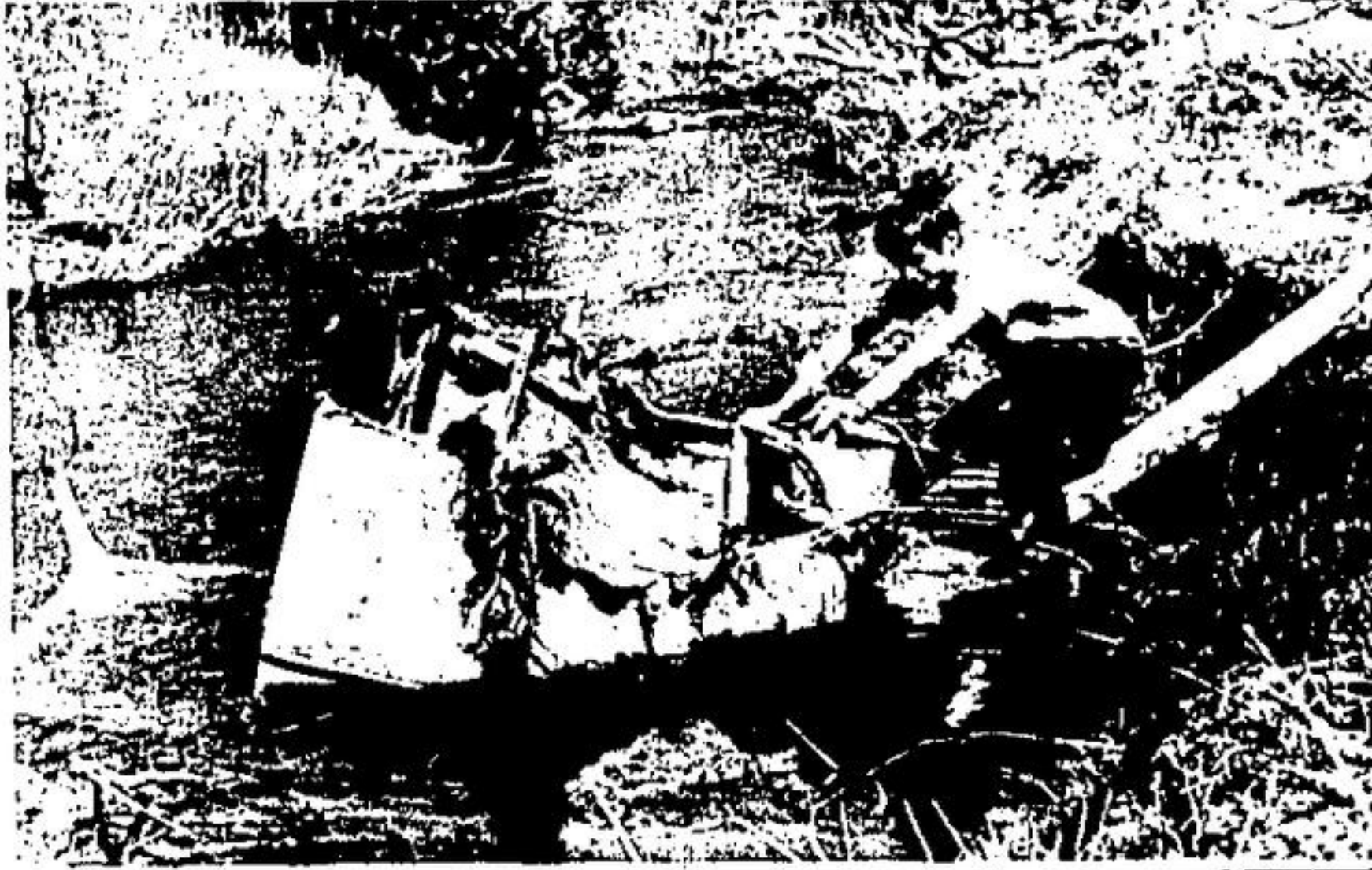

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FISH Organization is Good Neighbour Group

A speaker from FISH, a volunteer organization whose aim is to be a good neighbour, Mrs. Bruce Bartleman of Brampton, told about the organization to Unit Two of Norval United Church U.C.W. at their regular monthly meeting held at the home of Mrs. Ruth Hyatt on Wednesday evening May 12.

Mrs. Elaine Crawford introduced Mrs. Bartleman who explained that the organization has no office but will assist anyone who phones for help. They have a 24 hour answering service with all help being volunteer and free. FISH volunteers will provide transportation, visit, cook, home-make, baby sit, or help in any way in an emergency. The volunteers are a group of Christian men and women who are ready to help their neighbour in an emergency.

A fish symbol was used by the early Christians to denote Christianity, as they couldn't come right out and declare themselves Christian without being persecuted. 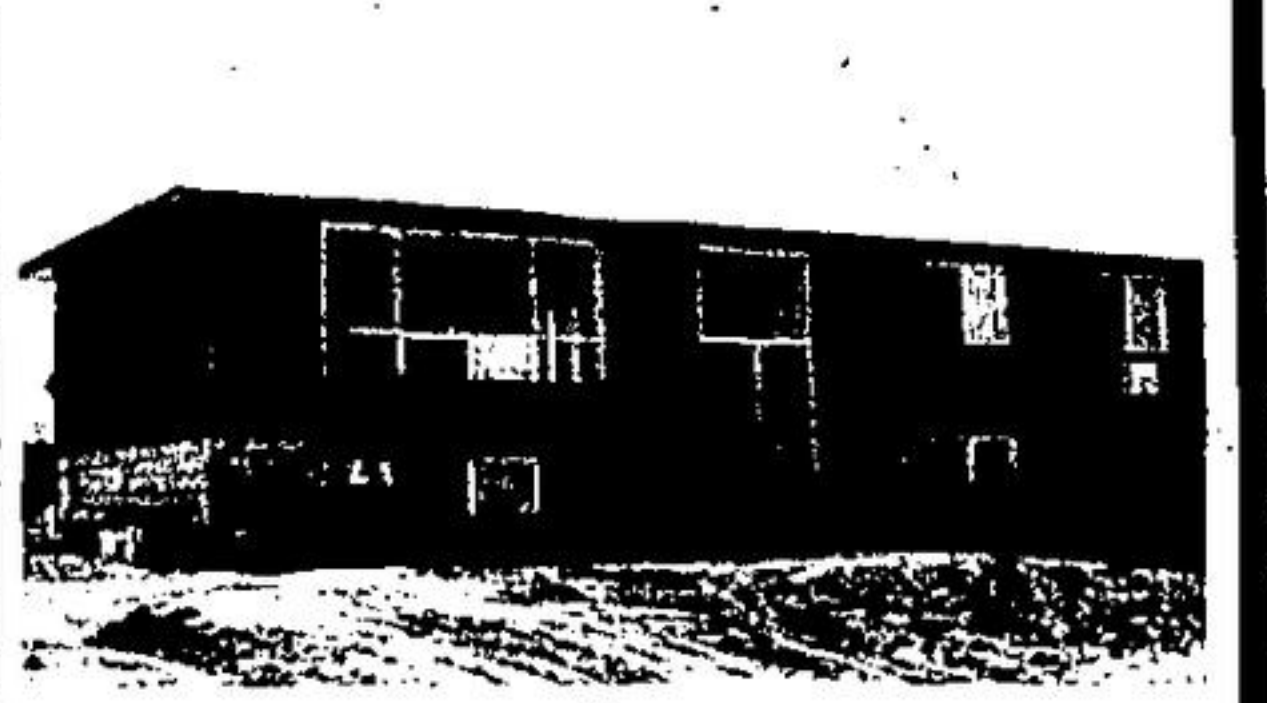
