



RECEIVE MAJOR ATHLETIC AWARDS

Four special athletic awards were presented at the end of Georgetown District High School's first annual athletic banquet May 18. Clive Llewellyn, left, received two of them—the Fokkens Award as outstanding boy athlete of the year, and Paul Legge Award as graduating student with a senior athletic award who has achieved the highest academic standing. **Clive Llewellyn, Jane Girvan
GDHS 'Athletes of the Year'**

Clive Llewellyn and Jane Girvan were named outstanding boy and girl athletes of the year at the first annual Georgetown District High School Athletic Banquet, Tuesday.

Jane Girvan received the Mary Patterson Award from Mrs. Patterson who is leaving the school's physical education department to become head of the guidance department. This is a new award in tribute to her work in girls' athletics.

The Fokkens Award was presented to Llewellyn by last term's winner Hugh Williams. Two other major awards were presented at the conclusion of the presentations.

The McLaren Award, presented annually to the student who has contributed the most to the athletic program as an all round performer was won by Rick Chaplin. Lyn McLaren for

who the award was named, was head of the Physical Education Department here for several years. He made the presentation.

The Paul Legge Award, another new award this year honouring Paul Legge's 13 years of service to Georgetown District High School as a teacher and coach, was presented by him to Clive Llewellyn. It will go annually to the graduating boy or girl who holds a senior athletic award and achieves the highest academic standing.

Awards also went to 28 teams representing the school in golf, cross country running, volleyball, football, wrestling, basketball, gymnastics, badminton, track and field, table tennis, skiing, rugger, soccer, and field hockey. Efforts of the cheerleaders were also recognized.

Frank Cosentino, University

of Western Ontario head coach who quarter-backed Hamilton Tiger-Cats, Edmonton Eskimos and Toronto Argonauts, of the Canadian Football League before joining the UWO staff last year, advised the young athletes to continue to develop their talents to the benefit of country, community and themselves.

"Increasing the quality of human life should be the prime goal of education," he said in prefacing his definition of the role of athletics in education.

Principal Mike Furlong termed the athletes, a special group possessing superior physical capabilities, the cream of the crop in their field. He reminded them that because of their prowess they are imitated and should therefore bear in mind the kind of example they are setting.

Nineteen students received

junior letters and eighteen senior letters for "outstanding contributions to both intra-mural and inter-scholastic programs."

At the conclusion of the awards presentations, Clive Llewellyn conveyed the appreciation of the athletes to the coaches to which Bill Bingham of the boys physical education department replied.

Boys physical education department head Dan Patterson arranged the dinner. With him at the head table were Mr. Furlong; president of boys' athletics Tom Ewles, president of girls' athletics Patty Monckton; the school's business manager, Ernest Forgrave; co-ordinator of physical education for Halton Nick Volpe; head of girls' physical education department, Mrs. Mary Patterson; and guest speaker Frank Cosentino, and student council president Tim Brotherton.

NORTH HALTON REPORT

During the week ending May 15 officers of the Ontario Provincial Police stationed at North Halton Detachment worked a total of 1,039 1/2 hours and patrolled 6,520 miles on Provincial Highways, County and Township Roads under their jurisdiction. Traffic violations resulted in 67 charges being laid under the Highway Traffic Act, while an additional 48 warnings were issued. Proceedings in Provincial Court, Milton led to 124 convictions being registered.

Officers were called upon to investigate 47 general occurrences during the 7 day reporting period. Included were: 4 thefts, 1 break and enter, 2 stolen cars were recovered 1 of which led to the apprehension of an escapee, 5 investigations under the Liquor Control Act, resulting in charges being laid against 4 persons, 1 sudden death investigation, 1 missing person complaint, 2 domestic complaints, 1 assault investigation 2 impaired drivers were apprehended and 1 premise was found insecure by officers on night patrol. Many other occurrences were of a minor nature and required little time to clear.

Only 4 motor vehicle collisions were investigated this week, however one of these resulted in death to 2 persons and sent 3 others to hospital. Two persons were injured in one of the remaining 3 mishaps investigated, while the remaining 2 resulted in property damage only. Total property damage was estimated at \$2,930. Defective equipment and careless driving were two contributing factors in the collisions. To date one charge has been laid, while others are pending.

Accident Prevention Personnel visited Georgetown District Christian School and Pineview Public School this week giving instruction in bicycle safety to approximately 495 students.

Bicycles often create a hazard for motorists. The SAFE cyclist thinks of others. May we remind all cyclists to ride in a single file and stay close to the right side of the road. Also, use two hands for safety.

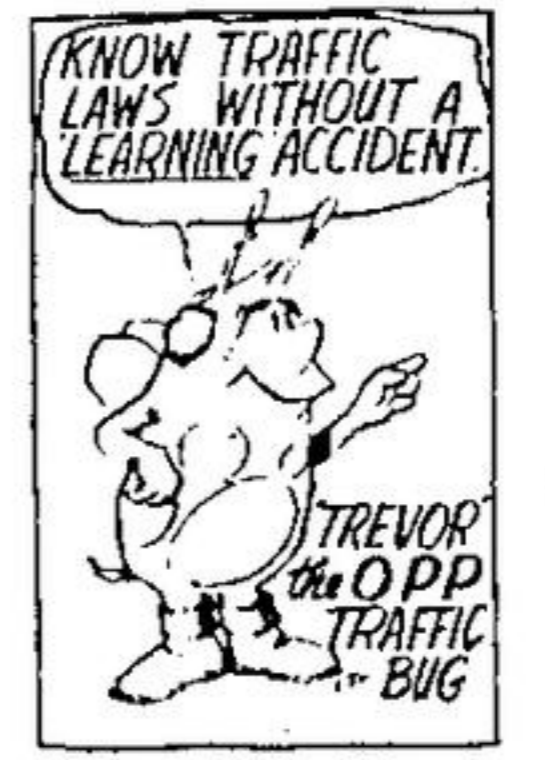

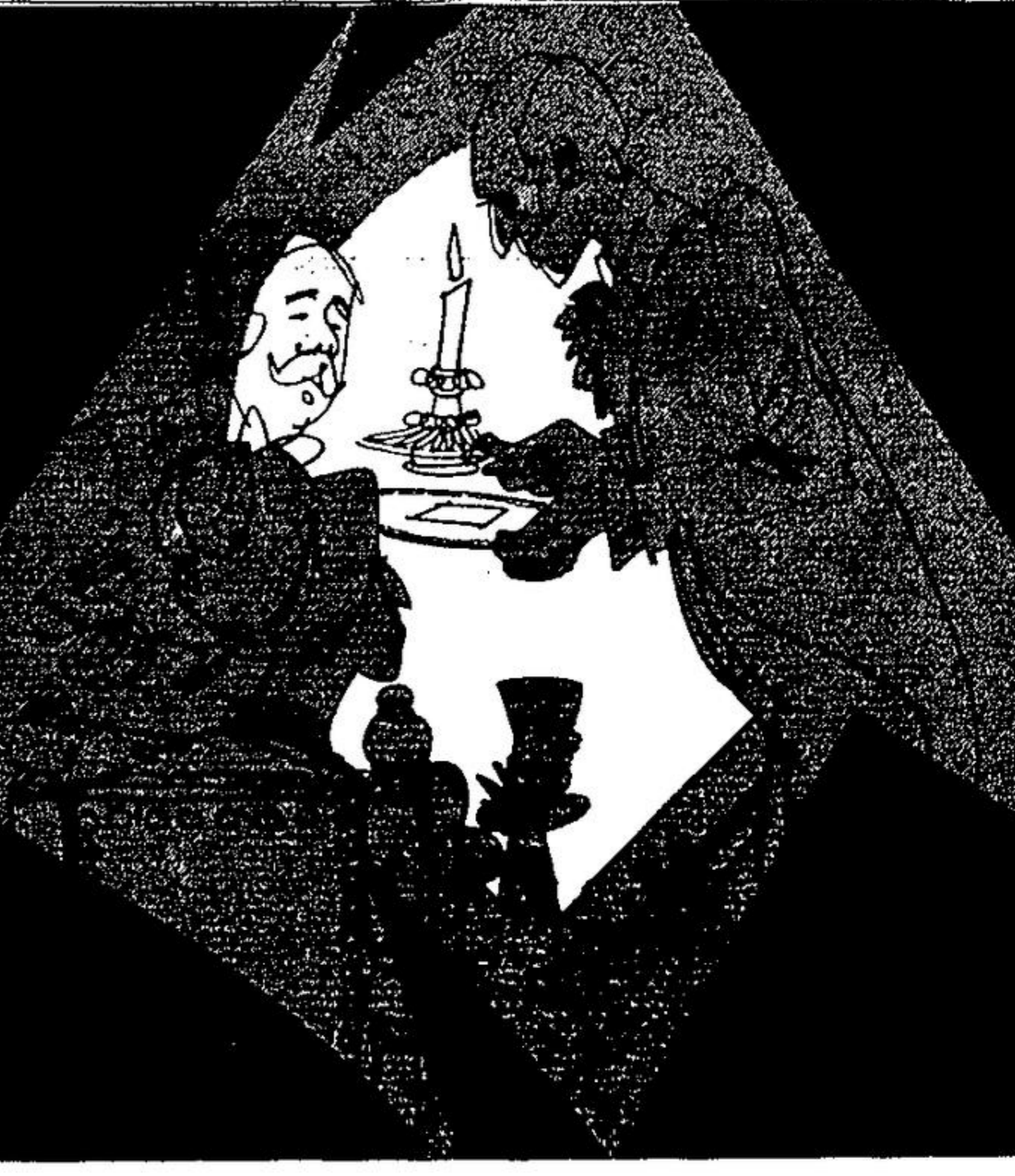
