leaving basically what are now the almost perpendicular banks of the lake.

"A spruce forest grew until about 10,000 years ago and it gave way to pine and fir," he said.

A deciduous forest replacing the coniferous trees about 9,500 years ago indicates there might have been a climatic change about that time and the warming trend reached its maximum between 4,000 and 5,000 years ago," MacAndrews speculated.

All that time seeds from the trees fell as part of the sediment into the water and fossilized as layers upon layers of sediment piled up.

Now the scientists are pulling up layers of sediment containing the fossilized seeds.

But they are really interested in the past several thousand years. This time is especially important to Maria Boyko, a University of Toronto student working towards her master of science degree. The lake sediments and what they will reveal during their summer study will form her master's thesis. She is interested in finding corn or maize pollen in the sediments and points out if she finds them before the 18th century layers, it could mean there was Indian agriculture in the area.

MacAndrews says the sediment which leaves a whitish layer in summer and black layer in winter, is also valuable to the Canada Centre for Inland Waters.

"By watching the sediment buildup over the past several thousand years, they can gauge a sediment budget for the Great Lakes," he said.

"This means they can gauge how fast the sediment can build up in the Great Lakes for the next several hundred years," MacAndrews said.

He said they could take core samples as old as 13,000 years when he believes the lake was first formed. It would require going 30 feet into the sediment to reach the bottom.

At that time a great glacier was retreating north and as it melted back an underground glacial stream eroded limestone shale from the lake. It collapsed

Crawford Lake Tells All -

Lake Sediment Reveals All Topography of Halton Area

A team of scientists and university students are pulling natural history "books" dating back nearly 2,000 years from the Halton Region Conservation Authority's Crawford Lake in North Halton.

The "books" are really samples of the sediment lying at the bottom of the lake and by examining the layers, the scientists can determine what the natural history of the lake has been.

Dr. J. H. MacAndrews, from the geology department of the Royal Ontario Museum and professor of botany at the University of Toronto, is heading a group. He says the lake is particularly unique in its make up and a valuable scientific tool.

The bottom half of the 75 foot deep lake barely circulates and sediment falling from the surrounding trees and banks settles to the bottom and lays there undisturbed.

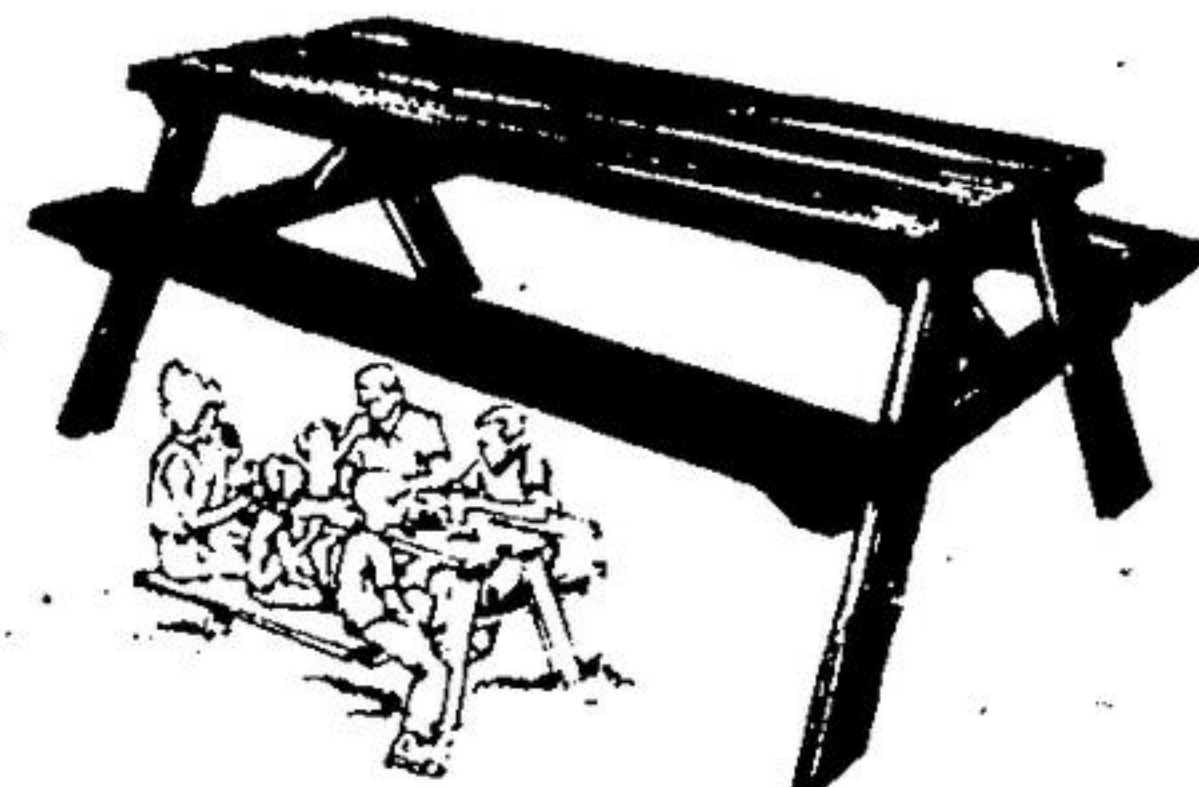

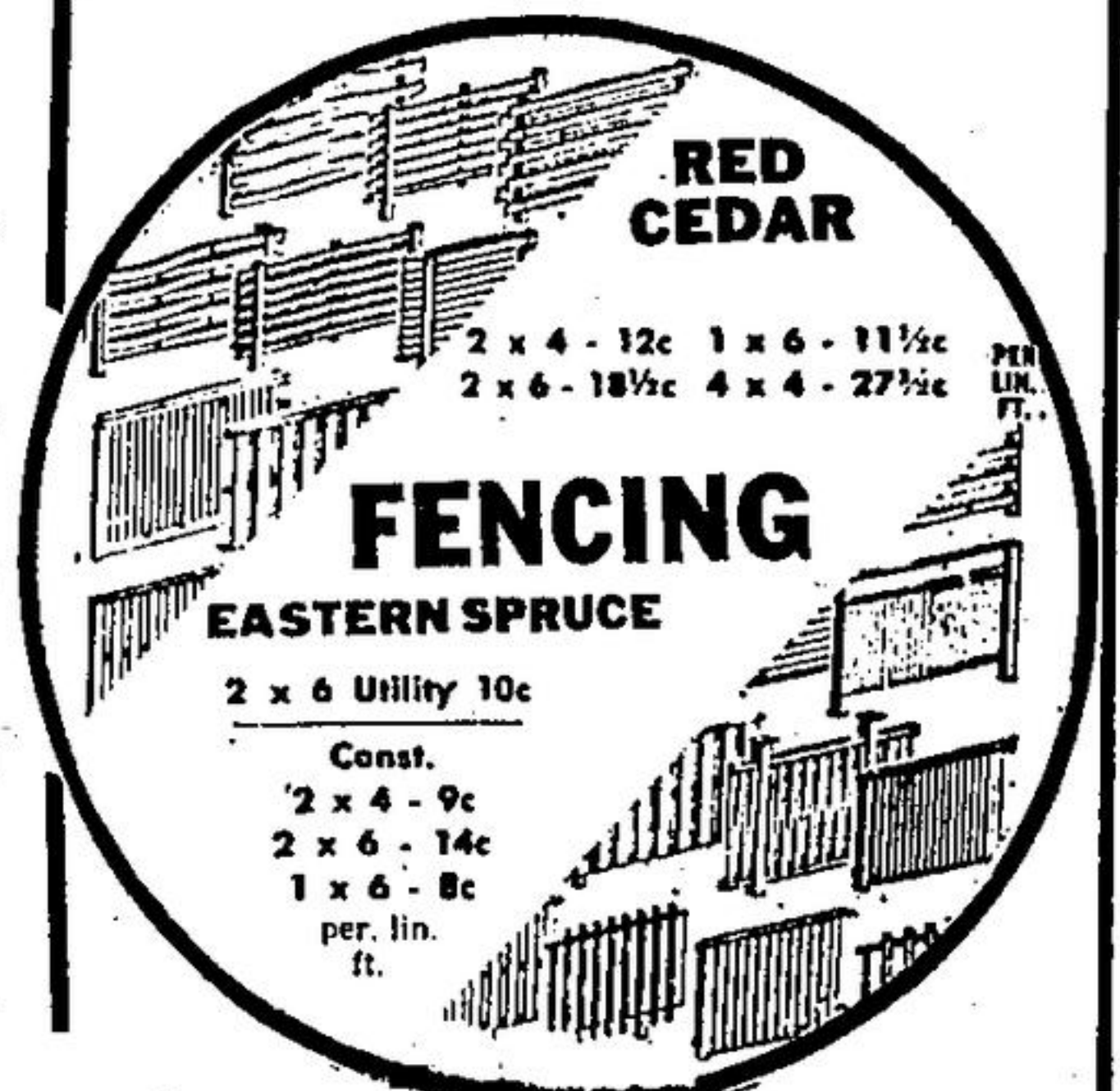
