

Kinsmen Will Illuminate Cedarvale Soccer Pitch

Georgetown Kinsmen hope to see work start soon on the installation of a lighting system for the soccer field at Cedarvale Community Centre. The club passed the motion to donate the lights and cost of installation three weeks ago after receiving permission from the Georgetown Recreation Committee to proceed. The project will cost Kinsmen about \$7,500. The lights will be suspended on four 50 foot concrete poles.

Some of the funds raised by the recent Kin Casino have been earmarked for the lighting project and more will come from a second Casino Nite later this year. Kinsmen and soccer league officials are co-operating on

technical work and some of the labour, but the actual installation will be handled by a professional firm. A Kinsmen spokesman said they hope to do the same thing for a softball diamond next year.
