

Georgetown Scouters Helped Construct New Training Lodge

The new leaders training lodge was officially opened at the Blue Springs Scout Reserve just west of Acton, Saturday, by Ontario Education Minister, Robert Welch.

Scout Dean Jackson held a symbolic cedar log firm while the minister went to work with a buck-saw in a twist on the traditional ribbon cutting.

SHARE COST
Cost of the \$55,000 building was shared dollar for dollar between the membership and friends of Scouting.

Construction of the Pan Abode building was done by volunteer help from Training Colleges and Scouters from Georgetown and other parts of the province.

FIRST LODGE
Many donations of finances and furnishings have enabled the provincial council for Ontario to establish the first training lodge.

The lodge has conference & sleeping facilities for 48 people. It will be available for the training of the 14,000 leaders currently involved in the Boy Scouts of Canada in Ontario.

A child's crib was needed for the church nursery and Mrs. John Wallace offered to look after this.

A committee of Mrs. Ward Brownridge, Mrs. Johnston Neelands and Mrs. Clifford Wrigglesworth was formed representing the three units to see flowers were placed in the church each Sunday. It was decided to hold a turkey supper on Wednesday, October 20th. Mrs. C. Wrigglesworth gave a report of the two Steward meetings held — one on April 12 and the other on May 10, also an official board meeting on May 20.

It was moved and seconded that \$1,000 be turned over from the UCW to the church building fund. Mrs. Frank Bucklell gave a report on cards sent and visits made. As their June meeting will be their Friendship and Visitation meeting they were asked to pick up cards with names of the shut-ins and sick people to visit before June 23. It was also decided to invite

been set up of dishes etc. — as well as a book display for anyone wishing a book to read.
