Election of officers resulted with D. Wilson, becoming Ontario provincial president, B. Jeffries 1st vice, D. Capperauld 2nd vice, V. Price 3rd vice, G. Loughlin, hon. treasurer, T. Cambden assistant hon. treasurer; R. Watson chairman, K. Brown vice chairman, V. Price has been provincial membership chairman prior to his election to 2nd vice.

MORE UNDERSTANDING
Several new articles will be added and several changes made in the Ontario provincial command general by-laws as a result of deliberations at the convention.

One new article which will be added will be entitled 'Ladies Auxiliaries'. This subject is much too lengthy to deal with in detail here. Briefly it aims to bring about more understanding and closer co-operation between branches and their auxiliaries.

FRATERNAL MEMBERS
Branches throughout Ontario provincial command may if they wish accept fraternal members. It is not mandatory. The number of such members will be limited to 30% of the number of life, ordinary and associate members of each branch. The position of ex-service women's representative has been abolished since it is felt that such office no longer is necessary. Ex-service women are on par with ex-service men in most branches in Ontario, they may hold office and participate in all activities within the branch, with the same privileges as the men.

GONE LONG WAY
Branch 120 can be justly proud of 766 Air Cadet Squadron which the Branch sponsors. Monday, May 21 the cadets received their annual inspection.

Parents of the cadets were on hand at the high school along with many branch members and a number of dignitaries from town.

In our opinion the cadets have gone a long way since the last annual inspection. There must have been a lot of work put in during the intervening period by all concerned, cadets, officers, and instructors. There was a reception held at Branch 120 after the inspection where parents, officers and the many interested people became acquainted.

Bass Fishing For Acton's Fairy Lake

Department of Lands and Forests will stock Fairy Lake with large mouth bass this year.

In a letter to Acton Parks and Recreation Committee, the department reported a 1970 survey of the lake found it contained small mouth bass and pike, but that it was not suitable for cold water fish like trout.

BRANCH BITS

At the annual election on Sunday there was little change. Norm Ward returned as president, Bruce Collins 1st vice, Russ Stephens 2nd vice, executive J. Ferguson, F. Nicholson, R. Timpson, and P. Chamberlain.

During the week ending May 29, members of the Ontario Provincial Police stationed at North Halton detachment worked a total of 1046 hours and travelled 11,941 miles carrying out their various duties. Driving violations resulted in 80 charges being laid while 39 other motorists received warnings regarding their driving habits. Proceedings in provincial court held in Milton led to 62 convictions being registered.

Officers responded to 33 general occurrences during the 7 day reporting period. Included were - 2 thefts, 1 of which involved a motor vehicle which was later recovered; 1 instance of breaking and entering; 1 fraud investigation; 7 investigations under the Liquor Control Act resulting in charges against 11 persons; 1 sudden death investigation; 2 complaints of trespassing; 1 escapee apprehended and 2 impaired drivers apprehended. Many other occurrences were of a minor nature and required little time to clear.

Injuries were sustained by 9 persons in 4 of the 9 motor vehicle collisions investigated during the week. Total property damage was estimated to be \$7,415. The accidents were attributed to careless driving, following too closely and improper turns. One dog was killed when it ran into the path of a vehicle. To date 7 charges have been laid against drivers involved.

Prov. Const. T. R. Ferrico conducted safety talks in 3 schools during the week including Stewartrtown public school. A total of 687 pupils were contacted.

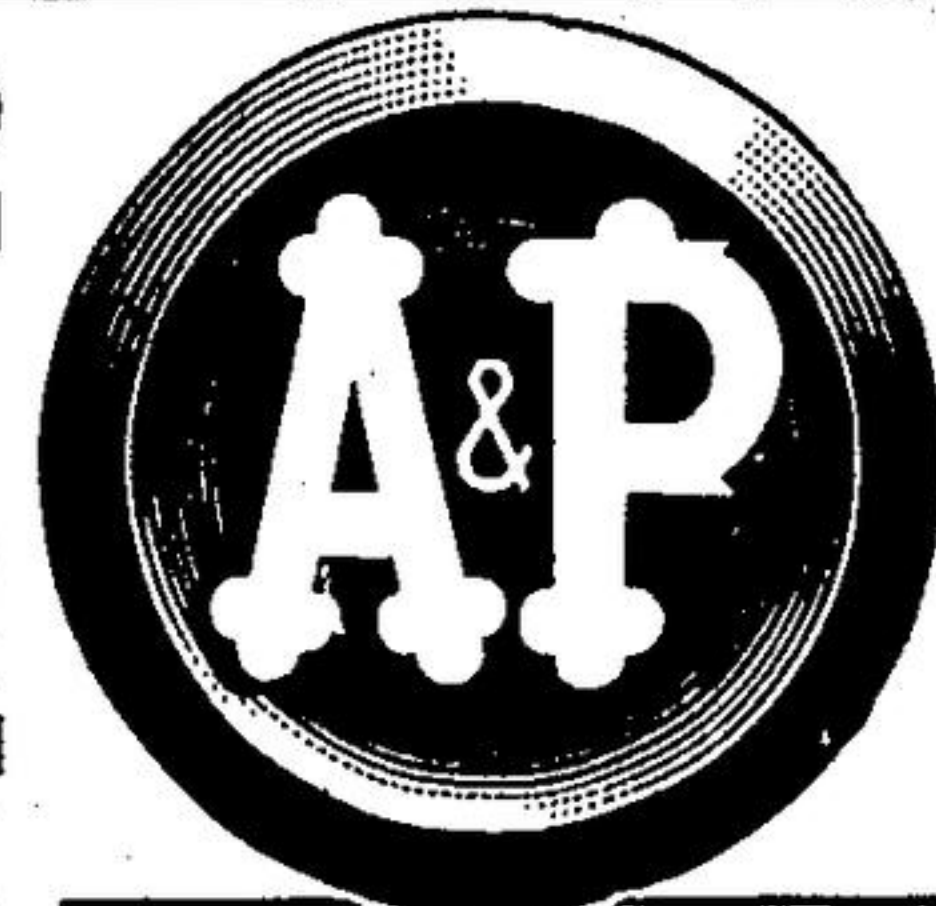
