Stream, Road Cleanups In New SWEEP Program

The S.W.E.E.P. is on! After a month of preparatory interviewing, 53 high school and university students in the Halton vicinity have been hired by the Halton Region Conservation Authority, for the Ontario Government's "Students Working in an Environmental Enhancement Program" (S.W.E.E.P.)

The program is sponsored 100% by the Provincial Government, with the students hired by the Department of Energy and Resources Management through its Conservation Authorities Branch, and by the Department of Lands and Forests.

quarter of the students hired are girls. The crews will be involved in stream and roadside cleanups, maintenance of conservation areas and assisting the Authority's technical staff.

HIRED 1,000
Each department has hired 1,000 students and receives \$1.2 million to cover the cost of wages and equipment.

CREATE WORK
The office staff began working last week with the work

crews beginning in stages for the next month. The program will be virtually complete by the end of August. The program is designed to create work opportunities for 2,000 young people, giving them a chance to participate actively in environmental management.
