


Faces at Centennial's Carnival

The major news item this week on the soccer front is the winning of the McLaughlin Trophy by the Georgetown Thistles (osquito) Representative team.

This trophy commemorates the 100th year of the designer of the McLaughlin automobile which subsequently became the Buick. He will be 100 years of age in September of this year. The tourney was held at Oshawa on June 19th and following is a brief summary of the action.

Two excellent goals by S. Magdy gave the Giants their first victory in one and a half seasons now that they are on the score sheet. I hope we shall see more wins come their way.


Boomerangs 0 Thunderbirds 3
