Go-Style Commuter Service Inches Closer To Georgetown

The long talked about possibility of commuter rail service for Georgetown may become a reality following a study announced last week by the Canadian Transport Commission.

Ontario and Metro Toronto governments will co-operate in the study aimed at creating a GO-style rail commuter network feeding into Toronto from surrounding areas, including Brampton and Georgetown.

About 12 of 40 lines into Toronto are considered suitable for the network which would feed into the planned \$200 million Metro Transportation Centre in downtown Toronto.

The system would connect directly with TTC rapid transit and bus services and into other public transit services in the commutershed area.

THREE LINES
Metro Chairman Ab Campbell proposed three main lines for the expanded commuter service: A northwest line running from Union Station serving Weston, Rexdale, Toronto International Airport and Brampton and Georgetown; a northern line linking the Yonge subway extension with Richmond Hill and Newmarket; and a northeastern route linking the Warden subway terminal with the proposed \$400

million Scarborough town centre, the new Metropolitan Zoo and Markham.

A Canadian National Railway official said the CNR will be helping the federal investigators with facts and figures relating to the study but that it was too early to make any comments on what the study may turn up.

10,000 TRIPS
In 1969, GO-transit branch did an evaluation of existing rail lines feeding into Toronto and an evaluation of GO-transit expansion.

This study turned up statistics which indicate an estimated 9,000 to 10,000 trips per weekday would be generated if GO-transit facilities were available on the Georgetown - Brampton rail line.

The branch does not include in its figures the number of persons involved only the number of passenger trips, including returns, the system could generate.

Mr. Howard said these figures were not surprising as this area is the fastest growing in the Metro commutershed. He said the Georgetown - Brampton line showed a higher estimated use than any of the other lines included in the study.

At present, there are two trains that stop in Georgetown in the morning to pick up commuters.
