Reconsider, Council Will Now Give Fall Fair \$250

Over Reeve Ric Morrow's objection council okayed the \$250 grant to the Fair Board again this year.

The recommendation was passed at a committee meeting Thursday night, but won't be official until passed at a council meeting.

Reeve Ric Morrow repeated his argument of last week, pointing out the town was already contributing through the Halton County grant, and by maintaining the park.

Cr. Ern Hyde termed the fair, "a community effort which would be missed by most of the citizens". Referring to the \$250 grant he said "we spend more than that on crests for kids' jackets."

WHERE PROFIT
Cr. Donna Denison claimed council would be astonished

when the cost of putting the fairgrounds in shape after the fair, was known.

Reeve Morrow stated that the town has no control over the fair budget. "If you want to contribute over and above keeping the park in shape, why not give an annual prize in the town's name", he asked.

"We provide soccer and baseball fields, and still give the kids crests for their jackets", retorted Cr. Hyde.

Cr. Phil Siddall maintained that the town benefits from the fair. "However, if they make a profit I want to know where the money goes".

WHAT BUDGETS?
Cr. Donna Denison stated the Georgetown Agricultural Society receives a grant from the Department of Agriculture. "If we give grants we should know

what the budgets are", she added.

Reeve Morrow reminded council the town spent a lot of money putting the park back in shape after last year's heavy rainstorm.

"That's why they lost money and need money now", replied Cr. Ernie Sykes.

Mayor Bill Smith suggested council ask to see their budget after the fair.

PRETTY SILLY
Cr. Harry Levy maintained the fall fair was synonymous with the town, "and we'd look pretty silly if we made no contribution", he added.

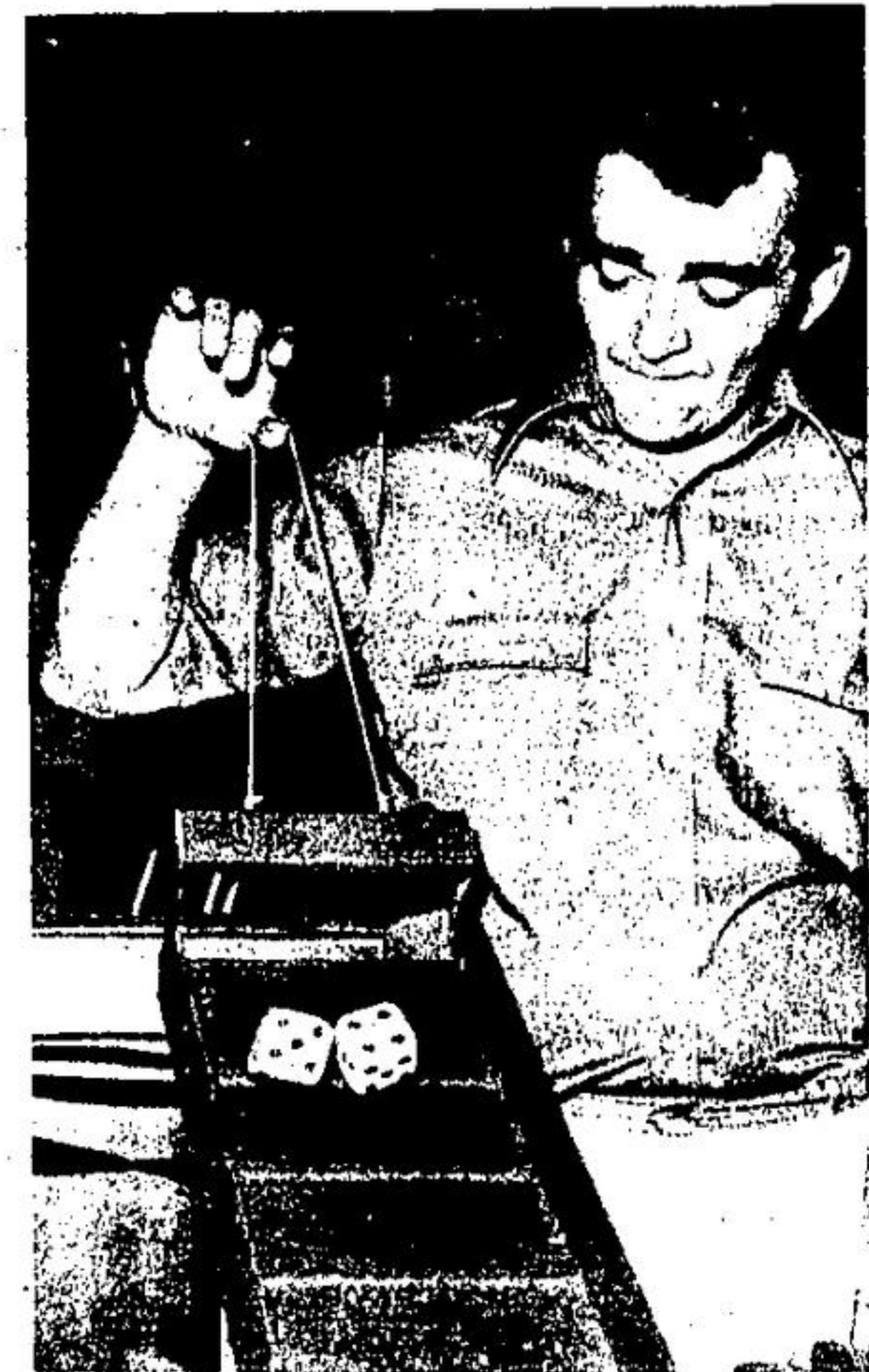
